

Blueberry Chocolate Wrist Warmers



Supplies and Notions:

2 colors of worsted weight yarn.
MC: Brown – Berroco vintage
CC: Blue – Brown Sheep
Worsted Superwash
US Size 5 dpns
One stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.
Two stitch markers for the gusset
Yarn needle to weave in ends

Abbreviations:

CO: Cast on
BO: Bind off
K: Knit
K2tog: Knit two stitches together
SSK: Slip, slip, knit
MC: Main color (Brown in sample)
CC: Contrasting color (Blue in sample)
YO: Yarn over.
P: purl

Pattern Notes:

Colorwork Pattern:

Rounds 1 & 2: Work in CC
Round 3: Work in MC
Rounds 4 & 5: Work in CC
Rounds 6 & 7: Work in MC
Round 8: Work in CC
Rounds 9 & 10: Work in MC

Directions:

CO 30 sts, join to work in the round. PM to mark the start of the round.

K 10 rounds in st st.

Picot edge: *K2tog, YO* repeat * to * around.

K 10 more rounds

Next round: Join your CO edge with your current round by picking up each stitch and knitting it with the stitches in the round (or, you can wait until the end of the project and sew or graft these edges together.)

K 1 round.

Thumb: K 14 stitches, PM, K1; CO 8 stitches using backwards loop or preferred CO; K1, PM, K 14 stitches.

Begin working colorwork pattern.

Thumb Gusset:

Rounds 1-4: K (38 stitches)

Round 5: K to marker, Sl M; SSK, K6, K2tog; Sl M, K to end of round. (36 stitches)

Rounds 6 - 9: K

Round 10: K to marker, Sl M; SSK, K4, K2tog; Sl M, K to end of round. (34 stitches)

Rounds 11 - 14: K

Round 15: K to marker, Sl M; SSK, K2, K2tog; Sl M, K to end of round. (32 stitches)

Rounds 16 - 19: K

Round 20: K to marker, Sl M; SSK, K2tog; Sl M, K to end of round. (30 stitches). You will no longer need these two markers.

Continue to work in colorwork pattern until glove measures the desired length: End with a K1 P1 rib for 6 rows in MC. BO loosely in pattern, and weave in all ends.
