## Snowflakes on Mulberries Hat

Design by Amy Klimt.
A fancy name for a hat that's quick, easy, and makes a great gift for anyone. The 6 -fold symmetry of the decreases on top of this stretchy ribbed hat form a snowflake when worked in the ice-blue stripes of this shade of Silk Garden Lite.

Skill Level: Advanced Beginner. Skills include working in round, knit, purl, directional decreases.
Size: Adult, to fit head up to 23 ".
Finished measurements: 8 " $[20 \mathrm{~cm}]$ wide unstretched, up to $12^{\prime \prime}$ [ 30 cm ] wide stretched, 8 " [ 20 cm ] tall.
Yarn: Noro Silk Garden Lite (45\% Silk, 45\% Mohair, 10\% Lambswool);137 yards [125 meters]/50g): Color 2043, 1 ball. Needles: Size US 6 needles [ 4 mm ], or size needed to get gauge: 16 " $[40 \mathrm{~cm}$ ] circular, 1 set double-pointed needles. Notions: 7 stitch markers ( 6 in one color, 1 in another),
 tapestry needle.
Gauge: 30 sts and 34 rows per 4" in k2, p2 ribbing, unstretched.

## Abbreviations:

CO: cast on
k: knit
p: purl
st: stitch
rnd: round
rep: repeat

## Directions

CO 120 sts on circular needle using long-tail cast on. Place marker and join to begin working in the round, being careful not to twist. Work k2,p2 ribbing as follows: Rnd 1: *K2, p2.* Repeat between * to end of round. Repeat Rnd 1 until work measures 5 " $[13 \mathrm{~cm}$ ] or 3 " $[8 \mathrm{~cm}$ ] less than total desired length.

## Crown Decreases

Setup round:
(K2, p2) twice, k1, PM, k1, p2.
*(K2, p2) four times, k1, PM, k1, p2.*
Repeat between * four more times. End (k2, p2) twice. Decrease round:
${ }^{*}$ Work in pattern (knit the knits and purl the purls) until 2 sts before marker, k2tog, SM, ssk.*
Repeat between * to end of round.
Work 2 rounds in pattern without decreasing.

PM: place marker
SM: slip marker k2tog: knit 2 together
ssk: Slip 2 stitches knitwise individually, then knit these 2 stitches together through back loop


Repeat these 3 rounds ( 1 decrease rnd, 2 rnds worked even in pattern) until 24 sts remain, switching to double-pointed needles when necessary. Do not work the last st of $2^{\text {nd }}$ plain round with 24 sts. Slip this st to beginning of round, moving beginning-of-round marker. Round should begin and end with 1 purl st. Last round: *K2tog, remove marker, ssk.* Repeat between * to end of round. 12 sts remain. Break yarn, leaving a tail. Thread tail onto tapestry needle and pass through remaining sts twice. Weave in ends. The hat may look a little nipple-y when flat, but not when it is being worn. It can be blocked to look rounder if desired.
