## Coaster Set



## Materials:

1 skein Fingering weight yarn (I used Knit Picks Palette in Mustard)
Small amount of worsted weight yarn for trim (I used Knit Picks Merino Style in Fairy Tale)
Size C Crochet hook
Size F Crochet hook
Size 4 knitting needles
Yarn needle to weave in ends


## Coaster \#1:

Using C hook and fingering weight yarn, Chg 6 and sl st to join ring.
Ch 2 (counts as $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{dc}$ ), dc in ring 17 times ( 18 st ).
Ch 2, 2 dc in each st to end, sl st in ch2 ( 35 st ).
Ch3, skip I st, dc in next st. Ch 2, (skip 1 st, dc in next st, ch 2) to end. SI st in ch3
Ch 2, 2dc in ch space, ch1, (3 dc in ch space, ch 1) to end. Sl st in ch2.
Ch 1, sc in each dc and ch sp to end,
Ch 1, sc in each sc to end. Repeat this row 2 more times.

With worsted weight yarn and F hook, sl st to beginning of round. Ch 1, sc in each sc to end of row, join with a sl st. tie off and weave in ends.

Coaster \#2:

Using fingering weight yarn and C hook, ch 6 and join with sl st to create ring.
Ch 2 (counts as first DC), 2 more DC. Ch 2, 3DC, Ch2, 3DC, Ch 2, 3 DC, Ch 2, join to Ch 2 with a sl st.

SI st once in each of next 2 DC , then sl st once in corner. You will use this method for moving your working yarn to the corner of the square at the end of each round from now on (referred to as "SL2C").

Ch 2. 2DC in ch space. Ch 2. 3 DC in same ch space. Ch 1,3 DC in next ch space. Ch 1, 3 DC in next ch space. Ch 2, 3 DC in same ch space. You are basically making a granny square pattern, so from now on, you will put 3 DC in every Ch space (besides beginning of rounds that begin with a ch 2 followed by 2 dc ). You will ch 1 between every set of DC clusters, besides in the corners. When working a corner, you will work 3dc, ch 2, then 3dc. So: For corners, ch 2 . For sides, ch 1. At the end of each row, join with a sl st to the Ch 2, then sl2c. Do this for a total of 5 rows. Tie off and weave in ends.

Using worsted weight yarn and F hook, join to corner with a sl st. ch 1.
1 sc in each dc to corner, skipping over ch spaces, making 3sc in every corner until end of row. Sl st to ch1 to finish row. Tie off and weave in ends.


## Coaster \#3:

Gauge: 12 st and 7 rows per inch
Using fingering yarn and size 4 knitting needles, cast on 25.
Row 1: (k1, p1) to end.
Repeat this for 37 rows.
Bind off; weave in ends.
Using worsted weight yarn and F hook, connect yarn to corner of work with a sl st. 1 sc in every other sc around the square, working 3 sc into each corner. SI st into first st to join round. Tie off and weave in ends.


Coaster \#4:
Using fingering weight yarn and size C crochet hook, ch 6 and join with a sl st to create ring. Ch 1, 14 sc , sl st into ch 1 to join round.
Ch 2. Dc in same st. 2 dc in each sc to end of round, join with a sl st to ch2 to finish row.
Ch 2. (1 dc in next st. 2 dc in next st.) repeat to end of row, join with a sl st.
Ch 2. Dc in same st. ( 1 dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{st}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next) to end. Join with sl st.
Ch 1.1 sc in each dc to end. Join with a sl st. tie off, weave in end.
With worsted weight yarn and F hook, attach yarn to project with a sl st.
Ch 1. Sc 1, (dc 1, trc 1, dc 1, sc 1) to end of row.
Tie off and weave in ends.

Using low heat and a bit of spray starch, iron each coaster until completely flat.
