Crooked Eyelet Scarf

My coat is *always* hanging open, so what could be better than a giant scarf to keep my middle warm? This simple eyelet scarf is kicked up a notch by knitting it on the bias. Since it's knit out of a soft, bulky yarn, it's still warm despite the holes.

Gauge: 2.5 sts/in, 4 rows/in pattern stitch, unstretched. Gauge is not important for this project.

Size 13 ndls or size required to get gauge

3 balls bulky yarn, 110 yds a ball

Finished size: 10" x 72"

Directions:

Co 35 sts

Bias Eyelet Pattern:

Row 1 (WS) p1 *k1, p3* across to last 2 sts, end k1, p1

Row 2 (RS) kfb *p1, k1,yo k2tog* to last 2 sts end k2tog

Row 3 p4, k1, *p3 k1* to last 2 sts end p2

Row 4 kfb, k1 *p1, K1 yo k2tog* to last 5 sts, p1 k2 k2tog

Row 5 p3 k1 to last 3 sts end p3

Row 6 kfb k2 *p1, k1, yo k2tog* to last 4 sts, end p1, k1 k2tog

Row 7 p2 *k1, p3* to last 4 sts, end p4

Row 8 kfb * k1, yo k2tog, p1* to last 2 sts, end k2tog

Repeat pattern until scarf measures 72". BO in knit on a right side row. Weave in ends.

Definitions:

K2TOG - Knit the next 2 stitches together as if they are one; 1 stitch decreased

YO – Wrap yarn around needle from front to back; 1 stitch increased

K - Knit

P - Purl

BO - Bind Off

CO - Cast On

STS - Stitches
