SIZE: This pattern is to fit the DAVIDsTea Steeper in the 18oz size.

MATERIALS

- Crochet hook 5mm to achieve gauge.
- Worsted Weight Yarn. I used Red Heart Super saver, but feel free to use a wool yarn to keep your tea extra cozy!
- ◆ Button

STITCHES USED:

Ch = Chain

SI st = Slip Stitch

SC = Single Crochet

HDC = Half Double Crochet

DC = Double Crochet

TR = Treble Crochet

Increase = two single crochets in one stitch

PM = Place marker

Adjustable Ring/ Magic loop: This technique ensures a closed, clean top. It's easy!

Left Handed

Alternatively, you can chain 2 and join, then crochet into the ring.

Please note: I am left handed, pattern instructions may be off or seemed reversed if you are right handed.

GAUGE:

Top circle (made in a round) should measure 4.5" across.

2" = 8 SC wide by 10 SC high.



STEEPER COZY

- Round 1. Create an adjustable ring and SC 8 into it (alternatively, you can ch 2 and join, then SC 8 into it.)
- Round 2. PM the first stitch to mark the beginning of rounds. Increase every stitch 16
- Round 3. *SC 1, Increase* repeat 8 times. 24 sts
- Round 4. *SC 2, Increase* repeat 8 times. 32 sts
- Round 5. *SC 3, Increase* repeat 8 times. 40 sts
- Round 6. *SC 4, Increase* repeat 8 times. 48 sts
- Round 7. *SC 5, Increase* repeat 8 times. 56 sts
- Round 8. *SC 6, Increase* repeat 8 times. this circle should measure 4.5" across. 64 sts
- Round 9. IN BACK LOOPS ONLY FOR THIS ROW. SC 52. 12 sts should remain unworked in this round.
- Round 10. Ch 1, turn. SC across until you hit your marker. 52 sts.
- Round 11. Ch 1, turn. SC across. Chain 13.
- Round 12. Skip 1 on the chain and SC 12 across the chain, SC'n off the 2 "V" loops (not the back bumps). This 12 stitch form will be creating a Flap. SC across the main form. 64 sts.
- Round 13. Ch 1, Turn. *SC 11, Decrease* repeat 4 times. SC 12 across the remaining stitches. 60 sts
- Round 14. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch. 60 sts.
- Round 15. Ch 1, Turn. *SC 10, Decrease* repeat 4 times. SC 12 over the Flap. 56 sts.
- Round 16. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch. 56 sts.
- Round 17. Ch 1, Turn. *SC 9, Decrease* repeat 4 times. SC across the Flap 52 sts.
- Round 18. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 19. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 20. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 21. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 22. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 23. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 24. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 25. Ch 1, Turn. SC 40. Leave the remaining 12 SC (the Flap) unworked. (40 sts)
- Round 26. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 27. Ch 1, Turn. SC across every stitch.
- Round 28. Ch 1, Turn. Increase in the first stitch. SC 20, Increase. Continue to SC every stitch until on the last stitch, Increase. (43 sts)

I wanted to get to 43 stitches for the edging of my choice. Feel free to adjust the number here if you would like to do a different bottom edging.

SCALLOP BOTTOM EDGING

Here is instructions for the edging I used on the blue cozy, but feel free to use your own edging!

Right side should be facing. Ch1, Turn. SI St the first stitch. *skip the next 2 SC, DC 5 in the same stitch, skip the next 2 SC, SI St in the next stitch*. Continue scallops until you are finished the bottom of the cozy.

EDGING

Work either a SC or SI St edging around the sides and across the flap.

BUTTON HOLE

To be worked on edging of Flap

Work edging till the narrow side of the flap work until the top of you buttonhole should be. I did SC 9 here. Chain the desired length of the buttonhole – I did Ch 4, then SI St it back to where the buttonhole should start – I skipped 6 stitches here. Turn and SC into the chain – I did 6 here. Then continue along working the flap edging.
