# Toothfairy Envelope

#### **Skills**

- knit and purl stitches
- knowledge of intarsia and handling floats helps

#### Size

• big enough for a tooth

#### Yarn

sockweight works nicely

#### Needle

as prescribed by the yarn

#### **Notions**

• stitch markers if you want to mark the edge stitches


### **Pattern Begins**

Cast on 13 sts.

Edge stitches form a garter stitch border, 2 sts ea side (4 sts for edges in total).

Work 12 repeats of the **seed stitch** pattern (this forms the front of the pouch).


Dark squares=knit



Knit across one RS row.

Knit across one WS to form a turning row.

Begin chart below from row 1 at the bottom, up to row 12 at the top using a contrasting color for the tooth motif, carrying main color floats behind. Odd rows are right side, even rows are wrong/purl side All pattern markings show what the stitch should look like on the RIGHT side of the fabric.



Fold the front of the pouch up to meet row 13 then slip stitch or crochet/chain stitch around the edges to seal the sides and create a border. Sew a button on the front that is small enough to fit through the yellow stitch in the flap above. Consider making that yellow stitch loose rather than making an actual button hole.

You may need to duplicate stitch/embroider parts of the tooth depending on the yarn


