# Santa Bangy (aka Penny's Hat)

Size: Adult Medium
Gauge: 16 Stitches/ 28 Rows = 4"

## Materials:

Yarn: Worsted Weight Yarn in Red (MC) (80 grams) and White (CC) (approx 10 grams) (l used two skeins of Berroco Pure Merino in Cardinal and some leftover white lion brand)

Needles: 1set Size 7 16" circular and 1 set dpn
(For toddler size, I used 1 skein each red and white Debbie Bliss Baby Cashmerino and size 3 needles) Notions: Stitch markers, cable needle

## Directions:

Ribbing: With Circular needle and CC yarn, Cast on 96 stitches and (place maker for end of round) join to knit in the round.

Work K1, P1 ribbing for 10 rounds (work 8 rounds for toddler size)
Join MC and work 1 round as follows:
*K6, M1 repeat from * around (total of 16 stitches increased = 112 stitches)
Round 2: *K4, P2, (place marker) K8, P2, K24, P2 (place marker) K8, P2, K4; repeat from * to end
Repeat round 2 twice, slipping markers as you come to them. Begin working Cable Chart 1 as follows
(Chart 1 shows half the stitches, repeat twice for a full round)
Round 1: k4, p2, c8f, p2, k24, p2, c8b, p2, k4
Round 2: k4, p2, k8, p2, k24, p2, k8, p2, k4
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Round 3: k4, p2, k8, p2, k24, p2, k8, p2, k4
Round 4: k4, p2, k8, p2, k24, p2, k8, p2, k4
Round 5: k4, p2, k8, p2, k24, p2, k8, p2, k4
Round 6: k4, p2, k8, p2, k24, p2, k8, p2, k4
Round 7: k4, p2, k8, p2, k24, p2, k8, p2, k4Repeat cable chart $1 /$ rounds $1-7 \underline{5}$ times (total of $\underline{6}$
cable crosses)
Top Point Shaping:
You are going to work some stitches and leave some stitches idle now. Arrange your stitches while working round one in the following manner.

Work first 36 stitches in established pattern (including cables) slip the last 16 stitches just worked onto a stitch holder. Switch to dpns and work the next 40 stitches (in pattern) distributing over 3 dpns as you work the stitches.

Join the 40 stitches for chart 2 and work in the round. All of the other stitches can remain on the circular needle while working this section. (At this point your work should look something like this: 16 stitches on stitch holder; 40 stitches on dpns, 36 stitches (last round worked \#7), end of round marker, 20 stitches (last round worked \#1) on circular needle. )

Working only on the stitches arranged on dpns and beginning on round 2 ; work Chart 2 once.
(Chart 2 worked over 40 stitches)
Round 1: k4, p2, c8b, p2, k8, p2, c8f, p2, k4
Round 2: ssk, k2, p2, k8, p2, ssk, k4, k2tog, p2, k8, p2, k2, k2łog
Round 3: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 4: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 5: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 6: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 7: k3, p2, k2, ssk, k2łog, k2, p2, k6, p2, k2, ssk, k2łog, k2, p2, k3

Round 24: k2tog (8 times) 8 stitches remain.
Cut thread and pull through remaining stitches

## Second Point:

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At this point there are 16 stitches on a stitch holder and 56 stitches on the circular needle, slip the first 16 stitches from the circular needle onto another stitch holder. Join a new yarn; (leave a really long tail for working up at the end) with dpns, work the next 20 stitches in pattern following chart 1 (stitches 37-56). This is now the beginning of round 2, slip the remaining 20 stitches from the circular needle onto dpns and work chart 3 starting with round 2 (work will be joined mid round).
(Chart 3 worked over 40 stitches)
Round 1: k4, p2, c8f, p2, k8, p2, c8b, p2, k4
Round 2: ssk, k2, p2, k8, p2, ssk, k4, k2tog, p2, k8, p2, k2, k2tog
Round 3: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 4: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 5: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 6: k3, p2, k8, p2, k6, p2, k8, p2, k3
Round 7: k3, p2, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2, p2, k6, p2, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2, p2, k3
Round 8: k3, p2, c6f, p2, k6, p2, c6b, p2, k3
Round 9: ssk, k1, p2, k6, p2, ssk, k2, k2tog, p2, k6, p2, k1, k2tog

8 stitches remain
Cut yarn and pull thru point
Finishing:
You should have two sets of 16 stitches each on stitch holders ... transfer each set to a dpn
Graft (Kitchener stitch) across the 32 live stitches and use the tail to close the holes on the sides of the points.

For the grafting averse.... Turn inside out and do a 3 needle bind off then close up holes on either side where points meet top of hat.

Weave in ends, make two pom-poms with CC yarn and attach to ends of points.

Knit 2 stitches together k2tog


Purl 2 Together
p2tog
slip, slip, knit slipped sts together

sl 2 to back, k2, k2 sts from cn

sl 3 to back, k3, k3 sts from cn


Sl 4 to back, k4, k4 sts from cn


Sl 2 to front, $\mathrm{k} 2, \mathrm{k} 2$ sts from cn

sl 3 to front, $\mathrm{k} 3, \mathrm{k} 3$ sts from cn

sl 4 to front, $\mathrm{k} 4, \mathrm{k} 4$ sts from cn
