
The Ericaceae Cowl By Emily Violet



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## Materials:

- size 7 (4.5 mm.) needles

- 180 yardsworsted weight yarn (sample: One skein of Malabrigo Merino Worsted in colorway "Burgundy" - 210 yards)

- size 7 (4.5 mm.) cable needle/DPN

- tapestry needle

- skill and patience :)

## Pattern Notes:

The Ericaceae Cowl is a simple, yet unique cowl that's perfect for chilly evenings and walks through the park. The chain cable resembles small red (ericaceae) berries. The combination of the cable and garter stitch looks lovely.

Helpful Hint: When the symbols \* \* appear in the pattern, it means repeat what instructions are between the \* \* twice.

## Pattern

CO 40 stitches Row 1) K8, (pm), k24, (pm) K8 Row 2) K8, (slm), p24, (slm) K8 Row 3) same as row 1 Row 4) same as row 2 Row 5) K8 (slm) \*sl 3 sts onto CN and hold to back, K3, K3 from CN, sl 3 sts onto CN and hold to front, K3, K3 from CN\*, (slm) K8 Ericaceae Cowl Row 6) same as row 2 Row 7) same as row 1 Row 8) same as row 2 Row 9) same as row 1 Row 8) same as row 2P Row 9) same as row 1 Row 10) same as row 2 Row 11) K8 (slm) \*sl 3 stitches onto CN and hold to front, K3, K3 from CN, sl 3 sts onto CN and hold to back, K3, K3 from CN\*, (slm) K8

Row 12) same as row 2

repeat these rows until your cowl is desired length.

Bind off your work, weave in the ends, and seam using your favorite method (sample: whip stitch). Block if desired.
