

The Forbidden Forest Cowl

··· Materials ···

Yarn: Any worsted weight yarn (I used Caron Simply Soft in colorway Pine, 100% acrylic, 330 yards)

Needles: size 7 US, straight or circular needles will do as this cowl is knit flat

Other: tapestry needle (for weaving in the ends and seaming), size 7 cable needle or DPN

··· Notes ···

The Forbidden
Forest cowl is knit
flat and the ends
are seamed
together. You
should be familiar
with cabling and
knitting knit and
purl stitches. There
is no gauge
provided for this
pattern.



··· Pattern Stitch Dictionary ···

K: Knit

P: purl

CN: cable needle

CO: cast on

BO: Bind off

Sts: stitches

···Gauge ···

In this pattern gauge isn't a crucial factor. For that reason, I did not provide you with a tension objective. On a happier note: go knit your cowl! No need to spend your precious time knitting up a boring old swatch. Cast on for this project and GO!

··· Pattern ···

CO 50 stitches

Row 1: K5, P3, K8, P3, K12, P3, K8,

P3, K5

Row 2: P5, K3, P8, K3, P12, K3, P8,

K3, P5

Row 3: same as Row 1

Row 4: same as Row 2

Row 5: K5 P3, K8, P3, slip 3 sts

onto CN and hold to back, K3,

K3 from CN, slip 3 sts ontp CN

and hold to front, K3, K3 from CN

P3, K8, P3, K5

Row 6: same as Row 2

Row 7: K5, P3, slip 4 sts onto CN

and hold to front, K4, K4 from

CN, P3, K12, P3, slip 4 sts onto CN

and hold to front, K4, K4 from

CN, P3, K5

Row 8: same as Row 2

Repeat rounds 1-8 until your cowl is as long as you'd like. BO and leave a long tail for sewing the two ends of your cowl

together.

Finishing: Weave in the ends, block if desired. Using your preferred method of sewing, carefully seam the two ends of your cowl together. Weave in any extra ends and ENJOY!







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
