



What a Mighty Good Manly Scarf

This simple moss stitch scarf can be easily altered for different yarn gauges and width by casting on fewer or more stitches.

The nubby texture and soft yarn makes for a very soft yet masculine garment. To get a nice clean edge, the first stitch is slipped and the last stitch is knit.

Finished measurement: 70" length, 9.5" width

Materials

Yarn: Berocco Inca Gold (80% Merino wool/20% Silk, 122yd/112m, 1.76oz/50g): 6407 Gris – 5 skeins, 610 yds

Gauge: $20 \text{ sts}/26 \text{ rows} = 4^{\circ\prime}/10 \text{cm} \text{ in St st}$

Needles: US 6 (or any needle size that gives correct gauge on mid-sized needles)

Definitions

Rep: Repeat Sl: Slip St(s): Stitch(es)

Stitch Glossary

Moss Stitch Pattern

Rows 1 and 2: S11, *p1, k1. Rep from * until 1 st remains,

Rows 3 and 4: S11, *k1, p1. Rep from * until 1 st remains, k1.

Pattern

Cast on 50 sts.

Work in moss stitch pattern until piece measures about 70" or until desired length.

Bind off all sts. Weave in all ends.

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
