



## *What a Mighty Good Manly Scarf*

This simple moss stitch scarf can be easily altered for different yarn gauges and width by casting on fewer or more stitches.

The nubby texture and soft yarn makes for a very soft yet masculine garment. To get a nice clean edge, the first stitch is slipped and the last stitch is knit.

**Finished measurement:** 70" length, 9.5" width

### *Materials*

**Yarn:** Berocco Inca Gold (80% Merino wool/20% Silk, 122yd/112m, 1.76oz/50g): 6407 Gris – 5 skeins, 610 yds  
**Gauge:** 20 sts/26 rows = 4"/10cm in St st  
**Needles:** US 6 (or any needle size that gives correct gauge on mid-sized needles)

### *Definitions*

**Rep:** Repeat  
**Sl:** Slip  
**St(s):** Stitch(es)

### *Stitch Glossary*

#### **Moss Stitch Pattern**

**Rows 1 and 2:** Sl1, \*p1, k1. Rep from \* until 1 st remains, k1.

**Rows 3 and 4:** Sl1, \*k1, p1. Rep from \* until 1 st remains, k1.

### *Pattern*

Cast on 50 sts.  
Work in moss stitch pattern until piece measures about 70" or until desired length.  
Bind off all sts.  
Weave in all ends.

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
