

Simple Striped Bunny

Smiles A Lot

I made a bunny disguised as a zebra as a random request for a friend so for Easter I decided that I should make another bunny in disguise. This time I wanted to make a rainbow bunny.

The design is really simple and just uses scraps of double knit or worsted weight wool

Need:

- 3 mm crochet hook.
- Double Knitting or Worsted wool in the following colours:
 - Colours for the stripes
 - Colour for the bunny
 - Pink (for the nose)
 - Black or other dark colour (for eyes)
- Stitch Markers.
- Tapestry needle
- Stuffing.



Pattern: (English terms used)

Body and Head

The first 12 rows use alternating colours for the stripes

- Row 1. dc 6 in a magic ring slip stitch to close (6)
Row 2. ch 1, inc around slip stitch to close (12)
Row 3. ch 1, (dc, inc) around slip stitch to close (18)
Row 4. ch 1, (dc, dc, inc) around slip stitch to close (24)
Rows 5-13. ch 1, dc around, slip stitch to close. (24)

change to colour of the bunny

- Row 14. ch1, in back loops only (dc, dc, dec) around, slip stitch to close. (18)
Row 15. ch1, dc around, slip stitch to close. (18)
Row 16. ch1, (dc, dec) around, slip stitch to close (12)
Row 17. ch1, dc around, slip stitch to close. Stuff body (12)
Row 18. ch1, dec around, slip stitch and fasten off (6)
Sew hole closed

Ears (make 2)

Using the colour of the bunny

ch 6, dc in 2nd chain from hook and along chain. dc 2 in last chain and dc down along other side of chain. Fasten off and sew to head.



Tail:

Using the colour of the bunny

Row 1: dc 4 in magic ring.

Row 2: dc 4 around, fasten off and sew to body.



Making Up

Sew the ears and tail onto the body.

Sew a little pink nose and sew on the eyes with the dark wool.
