

#### to make me, you will need:

- -5mm hook
- -a small amoutn of ww yarn in light pink, medium pink, light blue and medium blue
- -around 250 yards of white. You might use more or less, but that's a good amount to start with.

#### First, we'll need to chain. A lot.

How much you chain largely depends on personal preference. Don't count the number, just chain until it's long enough. Measure it completely un-stretched. 50" is the length of mine, I think it's a pretty good length for people of all sizes, but you can make it shorter or super long if you want! It totally doesn't matter in regards to the pattern, so do what you like.

R1: dc in each st

**R2:** turn, chain 1. \*3yo puff stitch, skip\* repeat. If your last stitch ends up being a skip, do a dc instead.

R3: turn, chain 2. dc into each st

R4: repeat R3

**R5:** turn, chain 2. \*dc, chain 2, skip 2\* repeat. If your last stitch ends up being a skip, do a dc

instead.

R6: repeat R3

R7: repeat R3

R8: repeat R2

**R9:** repeat R3 don't bind off!

Before you bind off, do two horizontal sc rows on the short edge you're at. Do two sc per row, with a total of 18sc.

Now switch to light pink, chain and turn. Do 4 rows of light pink, 4 rows of medium blue, then 4 rows of light blue. Always chain 1 and turn with a new row.

Now, still staying with the light blue, turn, chain 1 and sc just 9 times, then chain 1, turn, and dec2tog. Then sc x 7, chain 1, turn (8). Now sc 6 times, and dec2tog (7). Then chain 1, turn, dec2tog, and sc x 5 (6). You see the pattern here? Keep decreasing in the middle until you only have 2 stitches left, then bind off and weave in your ends.

On the 2nd point, start here > and repeat the same steps.

Now do the same thing on the other side with light blue, medium pink and light pink!







Now we'll make the bows! Grab white and chain 10, turn, then sc x 9. Now chain, but instead of turning, keep going and do 9 sc into the other side of your foundation chain. You will sc into the st indicated by the pink yarn. Then do one more chain and you'll have a long oval with 20 total stitches. The rest is crocheted in the round. That was R1.



Now switch your yarn color to pink or blue.

**R4:** \*sc x 3, dec2tog\* repeat (12)

**R5:** \*sc, dec2tog\* repeat (8)

Now bind off. You've got 1/2 of a bow! Leave a long tail on one of them, but not both. Use the tail to sew the pieces together, plus to attach a hair clip or pinback!

I did a hair clip because it works on the scarf OR your hair! But a pin would look cute on a cardigan, too.

OR you can sew the bow directly to the scarf. It's up to you!!







You don't have to do half regular/half shiny, you can just do the regular colors or just the shiny colors if you want! You can make more bows! You can make a 10ft scarf!
