ANNIE by Jane Richmond



A double-wrap cowl with a reversible stitch pattern that creates a beaded rib on the right side and a richly textured fabric on the wrong side. Written for two different weights of yarn, the Annie cowl is worked flat and seamed together after blocking. Instructions are given for both a DK weight and bulky version.

Needles

DK Version /// 3.75 mm/US5 needles **Bulky Version** /// 6.5 mm/US10.5 needles

Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the proper gauge.

Notions

Yarn needle

Yarn

DK Version /// 1 x 200g/7oz skein Alpaca and Bamboo blend from Alpaca Farm BC (90% Alpaca/10% Bamboo, 500m/547yds)

Bulky Version /// 3 x 100g/3.5oz skeins Swans Island Natural Colors Merino Bulky (100% organic Merino Wool, 130 yds/120 m). *Sample shown used approximately 300yds/275m.*

Gauge

DK Version ///

21 sts and 28 rows = 4in/10cm in St st 27 sts and 33 rows = 4in/10cm in patt st (unblocked)

Bulky Version ///

14 sts and 20 rows = 4in/10cm in St st 17 sts and 22 rows = 4in/10cm in patt st (unblocked)

Finished Measurements

63in/160cm circumference and 8in/20.5cm wide (blocked and seamed)

DIRECTIONS

Directions are written for DK weight yarn with instructions for bulky weight in parenthesis.

Using long tail method, CO 55 (33) sts.

Row 1 (WS): SI 1, [p1, k1] to last 2 sts, p2. **Row 2 (RS):** SI 1, knit to end of row.

Repeat these two rows until cowl measures 54in/137cm, ending with a **WS** row. BO loosely knitwise.

Finishing

Wet block to 63in/160cm long and 8in/20.5cm wide. Seam CO and BO edges together using a whip stitch. Weave in ends.

BO bind-off CO cast-on k knit purl RS right side patt pattern slip stitch(es) st(s) Stockinette stitch St st WS wrong side
