

This is really a 'recipe' for a basic asymmetrical triangular scarf. It can easily be modified with different stitch patterns.

I knit this with some fingering/DK weight handspun yarn, but any yarn will work. Great way to use one skein of beautiful yarn.

Use the size of knitting needles appropriate for your yarn. Gauge isn't important.

## **Basic Asymmetrical Scarf**

Cast on 5 stitches.

Row 1 (RS): KFB, work in pattern to last 2 stitches, K2TogB.

Row 2 (WS): KTB, work in pattern to the last stitch, KFB

Work these two rows for the desired length, bind off on a wrong side row.

## Stitch Pattern

Row 1(RS): K

Row 2(WS): P

Row 3: K

Row 4: P

Rows 5-9: K

Row 10: P

Row 11: K

Row 12: P

Rows 13+14: K

Row 15: \*YO, K2Tog\* repeat

Row 16: K

Repeat these 16 rows for the length of the scarf.

The pattern is basically small sections of stockinette, garter, stockinette, and garter lace.

The garter keeps the scarf from curling.

**Note** - at the end of every second garter lace (YO, K2Tog) row there is an extra stitch, you can either just knit it or knit to the last 3 stitches and slip one, K2TogB, pass slip stitch over.

## **Abbreviations**

**K** - knit

P - purl

KTB - knit through the

back

**KFB** - knit front and back

(single increase)

**K2TogB** - knit 2 together

through the back

YO - yarn over

K2Tog - knit 2 together

**RS** - right side

**WS** - wrong side
