

SUPER SCARF FOR KNITTING FRAMES


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- Make it one of 2 gauges: Lion Thick
 Quick yarns on the Knifty Knitter or
 Lion "Big" yarn on a frame with 1"
 spacing between the pegs
- Learn a quick method of creating ribbing on the frame
- Super scarf is super warm, super sized super quick and super simple

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Cast on by e-wrapping 2 pegs, skipping 2, wrapping 2 and so on. For Knifty knitter, 12 pegs total should be wrapped. For larger loom, 8 pegs
- 2. For 60" scarf, knit 180 rows for Thick and Quick version, 120 for Big version, wrapping each row as the cast on was wrapped. Ladders are forming between the working stitches
- 3. Remove knitting from loom on a separate





length of yarn to hold stitches. Knitting will appear as at left below

4. Begin a column of rib as pictured below. Working from the purl side, twist the bottom rung of the ladder with a crochet hook to make a loop. Pull the next bar

through the loop. A new loop has formed, work up the ladder, pulling each rung through the new loop formed one at a time. Photo above right shows left column already ribbed and center being started. You may prefer to use a rug latch hook to do this work instead of a crochet hook. This method of forming ribbing is called "latching up". it must be done from the purl side of the work. It is a fast way to rib an entire column of stitches. Latching up may also be done where stitches have been knitted, then run down to create the ladder





5. Bind off the open stitches at the final

end of the scarf.

6. Give the whole thing a lengthwise tug to set the stitches and even out the newly formed ribs. Photo at left shows the finished fabric. Kit side of fabric shows at left of photo, purl side with the manually latched ribs shows at right. This is a 2/1 rib or knit 2 purl 1 rib. Other versions using the same technique

To make a longer or shorter scarf, knit more or fewer rows. The approximate rows per inch of Thick and Quick yarns=3, Big=2
