

Lovely Little Letters

Capital I or Lowercase l

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Supplies:

G hook

Approximately 2 ounces acrylic worsted weight yarn
polyfill stuffing

Gauge: 14 rows and 17 sc = 4 inches Gauge is not extremely important to this project; however, if your gauge is off, your letter may not be in the exact proportions as the photographed letters.

Notes:

Project is made in two pieces from the bottom up.

Instructions: Make two.

Ch 6

Row 1: Sc in second ch from the hook and each across.

Ch 1, turn. (5 sc)

Row 2-29: Sc in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. (5 sc)

Row 30: Sc in each sc across. (5 sc) End off, leaving long tail for sewing two pieces together.



Assembly: Whip stitch the outer edges of two sides of the letter together. Be careful not to sew too much at once or you will have a hard time stuffing the letter.

Option 2: Make two.

Note: This version requires the Foundation Single Crochet stitch. Foundation single crochet (fsc) stitch instructions: Insert hook in bottom of stitch just completed, yo pull through bottom of stitch, yo, pull through 2.

Ch 14

Row 1: Sc in second ch from hook and each across. Ch 1, turn. (13 sc)

Row 2-4: Sc in each sc across. Ch1, turn. (13 sc)

Row 5: Sc in each sc across. Finish off.

Row 6: Skip 4 sc. Join with sc in fifth sc. Sc in next four sc. Ch 1, turn. (5 sc)

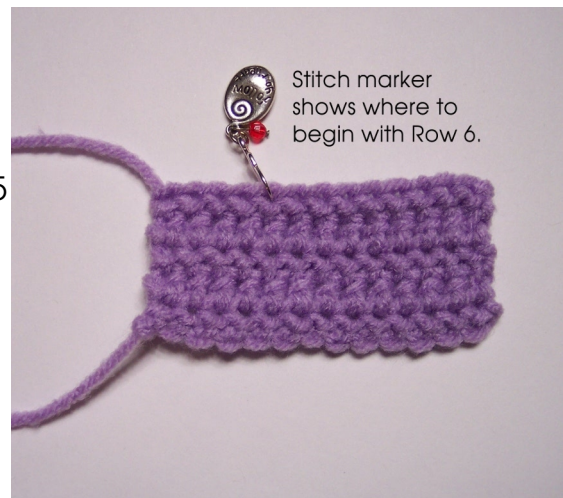
Row 7-24: Sc in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. (5 sc)

Row 25: Sc in each sc across. Ch 5, turn. (5 sc + 5 ch)

Row 26: Sc in second ch from hook and each ch and sc across. 4 fsc. (13 sts)

Row 27-29: Sc in each st across. Ch 1, turn. (13 sc)

Row 30: Sc in each sc across. (13 sc) Finish off, leaving tail for sewing together.



Assembly: Whip stitch the outer edges of the two sides of the letter together. Be careful not to sew too much at once or you will have a hard time stuffing the letter.
