

[LAST MINUTE OPEN RIB HAT] by Lisa Gutierrez

Simple knit hat uses a twisted rib pattern & large needle for extra detail.

MATERIALS

Approximately 3 oz. worsted (medium) yarn 4 mm (US 6) 16" circular needle 6.5 mm (US 10.5) 16" circular needle 6.5 mm (US 10.5) DPN Stitch marker

Yarn needle for weaving in ends

NOTES

Abbreviations:

K: knit P: purl

TBL: through the back loop

P3tog: purl 3 together

K3tog: knit 3 tog

Gauge (relaxed):

24 S x 18 R = 4"x4" in patt. w/larger needle. Dimensions (taken relaxed & flat):

Body: 7.5"W x 9"T (fabric is very stretchy widthwise)

To fit average adult head. Directions given to adjust for larger/smaller heads.

PATTERN

Twisted rib: *K1 tbl, P1; repeat from * around.

BRIM

With smaller needle, CO 80 stitches. Join, being careful not to twist, place marker.

Repeat twisted rib round for 1" (~8 rounds).

BODY

Switch to larger needle and repeat twisted rib round for 6 more inches (~27 rounds).

CROWN

(switch to DPN when necessary) Round 1: *[K1 tbl, P1] twice, K1, P3tog; repeat from * around. (60 sts)

Round 2-4: *K1tbl, P1; repeat from * around. ADJUSTMENTS

Round 5: *K1 tbl, P1, K1 tbl, P3tog; repeat from * around. (40 sts)

Round 6: Repeat round 2.

Round 7: *K1 tbl, P3tog; repeat from * around. (20 sts)

Round 8: Repeat round 2.

Round 9: *K2tog tbl* around. (10 sts)

Round 10: Knit all stitches tbl.

Cut yarn, leaving 10" tail. Pull end through live stitches and close off. Weave in ends.

To make a wider hat, CO a larger # of stitches, in multiples of 20. If brim is too wide at 100 stitches, consider making the brim at 80 and increasing to 100 before you make the body. To increase from 80 to 100, *K4, M1* around.

Making a taller hat will make it slouchier in the back. Making a shorter hat will make it fit a smaller head. I suspect a 5-6" hat before the crown would fit a child's head.
