

Sauge & Measurements

Gauge is not strict, but is approximately 12 stitches = 4 inches when blocked.

Maiya measures approximately 15 inches when blocked, and is designed to scrunch around your neck when worn. If the yarn you are using grows a lot when blocked in the lace pattern, you may want to cast on by 4 (or a multiple of 4) fewer stitches.

## Materials

- 120 yards bulky alpaca yarn.
- I stitch marker (recommended), tapestry needle.
- Size US 10.5 circular needle, or size required to obtain desired fabric.

## Abbreviations

CO - cast on

BO - bind off

EOR - end of round

k – knit

p – purl

YO –yarn over by bringing yarn to the front, then knitting the next stitch.

SL I, k2tog, psso - slip one stitch purlwise, knit two together, pull slipped stitch over.


Instructions

CO 60 place EOR marker and join in the round, being careful not to twist stitches.

Rnd I: \* pl, k3; rep from \* to end of round.

Rnd 2: \* k1, YO, s11, k2tog, psso, YO; rep from \* to end of round.

Repeat Rounds land 2 until piece measures 9.5 inches unstretched; if you are working with a less-drapey yarn, you may want to make a shorter cowl. BO very loosely in patt after working Round 2 of the pattern.



Finishing
Weave in ends. Wet block to open lace. Enjoy!
