



Simple Rhythm Scarf

Materials

Hook- USA – G – 4mm

Yarn- light worsted or DK

Gauge: Approx 20 sc = 4 inches

Abbreviations (USA terms)

ch – chain

sl st – slip stitch

sc- single crochet

dc- double crochet

* * repeat directions between * *

() – all directions between () in same stitch or space.

Note: The beginning and ending of rows can be tricky. The ch3 always counts as the first Dc in DC rows, but in the Sc rows the first ch 1 is merely a “turning” chain and not counted as a stitch. Remember to crochet in the top of the ch3 when you come to the end of the sc rows.

It is a good idea to count your stitches at the end of each row to make sure you are maintaining a constant number of stitches until you are confident that you have the “rhythm” down.

Begin - Ch 32

Row 1- Sc in 2nd ch from the hook, Sc in each ch across. [31 sc at the end of this row] ch 3 [counts as 1st Dc for row 2] - turn.

Row 2- Dc in 2nd sc, dc in each sc to end. Ch1 turn

Row 3 –skip 1st ch, sc in 1st Dc , sc in each dc to end of row, Sc in the top of the ch3 [which counted as first dc of row 2] at the end of the row. Ch 3 [counts as 1st Dc for row 4] - turn.

Row 4 - Dc in 2nd sc , dc in each sc to end. Ch1 turn

Row 5- skip 1st ch, sc in 1st Dc , sc in each dc to end of row, Sc in the top of the ch3 at the end of the row. Ch 4 [counts as (dc, ch1) in next row] - turn.

Row 6- Dc in 3rd stitch, ch1, * skip 1 stitch, (dc, ch 1) in next stitch* repeat across end with a Dc in last stitch. Ch1 turn



Row 7- sc in top of 1st dc, sc in next ch1 space,* sc in top of next dc, sc in ch1 space* repeat to last space created by the ch4 at the beginning of Row 6, sc in space, sc in 3rd ch, ch3 turn.

Row 8- Dc in 2nd sc, dc in each sc to end. Ch1 turn

Row 9- skip 1st ch, Sc in 1st Dc , sc in each Dc to end of row, Sc in the top of the ch3 at the end of the row. Ch 3 [counts as 1st Dc for next row] - turn.

Row 10- Dc in 2nd sc, dc in each sc to end. Ch1 turn

Row 11 - skip 1st ch, sc in 1st Dc , sc in each dc to end of row, Sc in the top of the ch3 at the end of the row. Ch 4 [counts as (dc, ch1) for next row] - turn.

Repeat Rows 6- 11 until you reach the desired length.

Do not Ch4 at the end of the final row. tie off after last sc.

Flowers

Use 2 colors begin with color A

Begin - Ch 5, sl st in 1st ch to form a ring.

1) 12sc into ring, sl st to 1st sc

2) *ch3, skip 1, slst into next* 6times around creating 6 ch3 loops. Tie off color A

3) attach color B to any ch 3 loop from round 2.(4 dc, sl st) in loop, *(sl st ,4dc, sl st) in next ch 3 loop*repeat directions in each ch3 loop, slst in 1st sl st of round .tie off.

The flowers are attached to each other and the bottom edges of the scarf as you go.

The attachment is made by slip stitching to the scarf or other petal in between the 2nd and 3rd Dc of the petals in row 3 of the flower.

Directions for placing the attachments:

First Flower - First petal is slst to t 1st stitch on the right on the bottom edge of the scarf. Skip 4 stitches and slst 2nd petal – complete the 4 other petals –tie off

Second Flower- First petal is slst to left side petal of 1st flower, skip 6 stitches from the last petal attached to scarf edge, slst 2nd petal to next st, skip 5 stitches, slst 3rd petal to next st. Complete last 3 petals. Tie off.

Third Flower – First petal slst to left side petal of 2nd flower, skip 6 stitches on edge of scarf- slst 2nd petal to next st, skip 4 stitches – slst 3rd petal to last st on left side of scarf edge. Complete last 3 petals, Tie off –

Weave all ends in.
