Keep the cold away from your neck and shoulders with this easy to knit little caplet. It knits from bottom up in the round and requires no seaming. The super simple stitch repeat, combined with a clever stitch count results in a spiraling pattern that creates a gorgeous drape.

Material:

6mm (US10) / 80cm circular needle A chunky yarn that knits on 6mm needles (Approx 400 m) Stitch marker <u>Dimensions</u>: 50 cm x 46 cm (20 in x 18 in)

CO 149 sts. Join in the round, being careful not to twist stitches. Place marker at the beginning of the round.

Border: Knit 2 ridges of garter st. in the round (row 1: knit, row 2: purl; rep. those two rows once more)

Body: *k5, p5*, rep. these 10 st. without interruption at beginning of each row. this will form the spiraling pattern. Continue until the body measures 22 cm (9 in) from the bottom, or desired length (keep in mind that a longer version will require more yarn).

Neck: remove marker and work the row until the next P5. Place marker to indicate the new beginning of the row. *k1, k2tog, k2, p5*, rep. to end of row. *k4, p5*, rep these 9 st. without interruption at beginning of each row. Continue until the work measures 27 cm (11 in).

k4, p1, p2tog, p2, rep to end of row. *k4, p4*, repeat until work measures 31 cm (12 in).

k1, k2tog, k1, p4, rep to end of row. *k3, p4*, repeat until work measures 34 cm (13 in).

k3, p1, p2tog, p1, rep to end of row. *k3, p3*, repeat until work measures 44 cm (17 in).

Finish: knit 2 ridges of garter st. in the round. Cast off loosely and weave in ends. Go out in the cold and show off ...



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
