

Snow Chick Free Crochet PDF

Snow Chick is from the crazy images in my head of a really cool snowgal with sassy attitude. She's hip and carefree. Got to look great if it's cold outside!



Supplies:

- ☺ 1 skein of Impeccable, White (acrylic) or any medium worsted weight yarn.
- ☺ 1 skein of Lion brand Tweed Stripes, Prism (acrylic) or any medium worsted weight yarn for making the hat and ruffled scarf.
This brand happens to be labeled as bulky but works well with Impeccable brand from Michael's.
- ☺ Small amount of any medium weight yarn for the mittens .
Red Heart Shocking pink was used.
- ☺ Size E/ 4 (3.5mm) crochet hook or any size to obtain correct gauge
- ☺ 1 set of 12 mm safety plastic eyes or 1 pr of black buttons.
Optional: black embroidery thread to make a pair of eyes if not using safety eyes.
- ☺ Polyester fiberfill
- ☺ 1 Stitch marker
- ☺ 1 Yarn (weaving needle)
- ☺ Gems for bling.
- ☺ Fabric Tac glue
- ☺ Orange or Goldenrod felt for cone shaped nose
- ☺ Shocking pink felt for mouth

Skill level: Easy and fun to make. Gauge is not important.

This pattern has photo references, even

for an adventurous beginner.

Need to know the basic stitches, seen in Abbreviations section.

Notes:

- ☺ After making numerous dolls, I found that crochet hook E/4 (3.5 mm) makes the tightest stitches.
However, the basic rule is to work stitches tightly so stuffing does not show.
- ☺ With the type of doll to make, called amigurumi, you will work in the round but do not join. I use a stitch marker to indicate the beginning of the next row as the work progresses.
- ☺ Refer to the photo references to see the progression of this project.
- ☺ You may use the adjustable ring method to start your rounds.
I still use ch 2, # sc in the second ch to start my beginning rounds.
There is no right or wrong, mostly, preference.

Abbreviations:

- ☺ ch: chain stitch
- ☺ sl st: slip stitch

- ☺ inc: 2 single crochet stitches in 1 sc
- ☺ tc: treble crochet
- ☺ dec: decrease or in this pattern, 2 sc tog is acceptable
- ☺ [] : work directions inside brackets as many times as indicated.
- ☺ st(s): stitches

Head: Make 1.

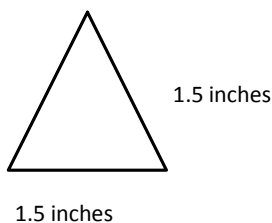
- 1) Ch 2. 6 sc in the 2nd ch st. (6)
- 2) place marker (PM). 2 sc in the next 6 sc. (12)
- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (18)
- 4) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 2 sc] 6 times. (24)
- 5) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 3 sc] 6 times. (30)
- 6) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 4 sc] 6 times. (36)
- 7) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (36)
- 8) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (36)
- 9) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (36)
- 10) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (36)
- 11) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (36)
- 12) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (36)
- 13) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), sc in the next 4 sc] 6 times. (30)
- 14) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), sc in the next 3 sc] 6 times. (24)
- 15) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (24)
- 16) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), sc in the next 2 sc] 6 times. (18)

* Placement of the eyes (using safety eyes, buttons, or even embroidery) is at this point because it is extremely hard to do after you close the shape of the head. I usually place at row 7 at 5-6 sts apart. See photo of head as reference.

Stuffing starts here if you like but I usually wait until I am closer to closing the gap.

17) Stuff with polyester fiberfill.

18) Fasten off and leave a long tail for weaving.



Nose: Cut a triangle shape with goldenrod felt. I measured 1 and a 1/2 inch each side. I rolled into a cone shape and used Fabric tac to adhere.

You may sew to the face between the eyes.

I used Fabric tac to adhere to the face.

No apologies for my drawing skills.

Mouth: Cut a half circle of shocking pink felt and add to face. I measured 1/4 inch.

Body: Make 1.

* *Starting at the base and working up to become the neck.*

- 1) Ch 2. 6 sc in the 2nd ch (6)
- 2) Place marker (PM). 2 sc in the next 6 sc. (12)
- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (18)
- 4) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 2 sc] 6 times. (24)
- 5) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 3 sc] 6 times. (30)
- 6) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 4 sc] 6 times. (36)
- 7) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 5 sc] 6 times. (42)
- 8) PM. Sc in the next sc. (42)
- 9) PM. Sc in the next sc. (42)
- 10) PM. Sc in the next sc. (42)
- 11) PM. Sc in the next sc. (42)
- 12) PM. Sc in the next sc. (42)
- 13) PM. Sc in the next sc. (42)
- 14) PM. [Dec or (2sctog), sc in the next 5 sc] 6 times. (36)
- 15) PM. [Dec or (2sctog), 1 sc in the next 4 sc] 6 times. (30)
- 16) PM. [Dec or (2sctog), 1 sc in the next 3 sc] 6 times. (24)
- 17) PM. [Dec or (2sctog), 1 sc in the next 2 sc] 6 times. (18)
- 18) PM. [Dec or (2sctog), 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (12)
- 19) Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.

* *Start stuffing body with polyester fiberfill at this time.*

Mittens to Arms: Make 2.

- 1) Using Shocking pink yarn to start the mittens.
- 2) Ch 2. 6 sc in the 2nd ch st. (6)
- 3) PM. 2 sc in the next 6 sc. (12)
- 4) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (18)
- 5) PM. 1 treble crochet tc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 17 sc. (18)
- 6) PM. [Dec or (2sctog), sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (12)

- 7) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog) in the next 1 st] and 1 sc in the last 8 sc. (10)
- 8) Change to White yarn to complete the arms.
- 9) PM. Sc in the next sc. (10)
- 10) PM. Sc in the next sc. (10)
- 11) PM. Sc in the next sc. (10)
- 12) PM. Sc in the next sc. (10)
- 13) Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing together. Stuff the arms lightly.

Ruffled Scarf: Make 1

- 1) Ch 51 Turn.
- 2) Sc in the 2nd ch and in each ch across.
- 3) Ch 3 (Counts as a dc) and turn.
2 dc in first sc. 2 dc in next sc to last sc across.
- 4) Ch 3. (Counts as a dc) and turn. 2dc in the next dc to the last dc.
- * Plan is to increase (2 dc in each 1 dc in the next row) to make the ruffled effect.
- 5) Ch 3. (Counts as a dc) and turn. 2dc in each dc to the last dc.
- 6) Fasten off and weave ends.

Hat: Make 1

- 1) Ch 2. 7 sc in the 2nd ch st. (7)
- 2) PM. 2 sc in the next 7 sc. (14)
- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 7 times. (21)
- 4) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 2 sc] 7 times. (28)
- 5) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 3 sc] 7 times. (35)
- 6) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 4 sc] 7 times. (42)
- 7) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 5 sc] 7 times. (49)
- 8) PM. Sc in the next sc. (49)
- 9) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), sc in the next 5 sc] 7 times. (42)
- 10) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), sc in the next 4 sc] 7 times. (35)
- 11) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), sc in the next 3 sc] 7 times. (28)
- 12) PM. Sc in the next sc. (28)
- 13) PM. Sc in the next sc. (28)
- 14) Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Assembly and Embellishment

- ❖ Connect the ears to the head.
- ❖ Add the cone shaped nose.
- ❖ Add the arms to the body.
- ❖ Add the arms and body to the head.
- ❖ Add hat to the head.
- ❖ Add ruffled scarf to the neck.

Idea: Can add embellishment such as felted buttons, or any decorative pins to hold scarf in place.

- ❖ Add beaded bracelet to the arm.

Not recommended for 3 yrs and younger for potential swallowing hazard

- ❖ Add gems to give some attitude to our snow chick.
