## French Press Coffee Cozy



Yarn: Cascade Yarns 220 Wool.
Gauge: 17 sts and 32 rows = 4" in garter st

Needle: US 7/4.5 mm
Yardage:
Brown - 50-60 yards
Orange - 5 yards
Yellow - 1 yard
Note about photo: This is the original coffee cozy, and I screwed up my row gauge a little bit. I'll make a new one and upload the photo soon, but the only difference between the photo and pattern is that there are the same number of rows on top and bottom of the coffee mug

I wanted a pattern for a french press cozy, and I've been really excited about working with colors lately. With very few options available on ravelry, I decided to create my own pattern. This french press cozy is knit mostly in garter stitch. The coffee mug in the center is a simple combination of both intarisia and fair isle knitting.

You can adapt this to use whatever size yarn you want, but pay attention to your gauge, especially the row gauge! The cozy must be a certain height and it looks awkward for there to be much more blank space on the top than on the bottom.

For the colorwork, you will have use 4 strands of yarn:
Br1 - this is the main color that you start out with
Br2 - same color, but different strand
Or - coffee mug
Ye - yellow inside the coffee mug
If you wish to make your coffee mug either larger or smaller, you can add or subtract as many rows of R20-21 as you wish. I have repeated R20-21 4 times in this pattern. Of course, if you do this then add/subtract the number of garter stitch rows on the top and bottom of the mug to match!

Color changes are indicated as -Br1, -Br2, -Or, -Ye.
Colors are indicated only when there is a change! It's possible that there are some errors in this. When in doubt, follow the chart!
The written instructions that correspond to the chart on the next page are in (parentheses).
co 52 sts
R1 -3: Work k2p2 rib
R4: K2, yo, P2tog, K2, P2, K2, P2, cont. to las 4 sts, K2tog, yo, P2
R5-11: knit
Note: color changes are indicated as - $\mathrm{Br} 1,-\mathrm{Br} 2$, -Or , -Ye . Colors are indicated only when there is a change. It's possible that there are some errors in this. When in doubt, follow the chart!

R12: P13, (K10, P7, K10), P12 -- <Br1>
R13: K12, (K10, P7, K10) K13 -- <Br1>
R14: P13, (K6, P2, K11, P2, K6), P12 -- <Br1>
R15: K12, (K6, P15, K6), K13 -- <Br1>
R16: P13, (K4, P1, K17, P1, K4), P12--<Br1>
R17: K12, (K4, P3, K8-Or, P8-Br2, K4), K13 - there are now three working strands
R18: P13, (K2-Br1, P1, K8, K10-Or, K3-Br2, P1, K2), P12
R19: K12, (K2-Br2, P3, P12-Or, P8-Br1, K2), K13
R20: P13, (K1-Br1, P1, K5, K15-Or, K3-Br2, P1, K1), P12
R21: K12, (K2-Br2, P3, P16-Or, P4-Br2,K2), K13
R22: P13, (P1-Br1, K4, K2-Or, K2-Br2, K13-Or, K4-Br2,P1), P12
R23: K12, (K1-Br2, P4, P12-Or, P3-Br1, P2-Or, P4-Br1, K1), K13
R24: P13, (P1-Br1, K4, K2-Or, K3-Br2, K12-Or, K4-Br2, P1), P12
R25: K12, (K1-Br2, P4, P12-Or, P3-Br1, P2-Or, P4-Br1, K1), K13
R26: P13, (P1-Br1, K4, K2-Or, K3-Br2, K12-Or, K4-Br2, P1), P12
R27: K12, (K1-Br2, P4, P12-Or, P3-Br1, P2-Or, P4-Br1, K1), K13
R28: P13, (P1-Br1, K4, K2-Or, K3-Br2, K12-Or, K4-Br2, P1), P12
R29: K12, (K1-Br2, P4, P13-Or, P2-Br1, P2-Or, P4-Br1, K1), K13
R30: P13, (K1-Br1, P1, K4, K6-Or, K3-Ye, K1-Or, K4-Ye, K2-Or, K3-Br2, P1, K1), P12 - now 4 strands!
R31: K12, (K2-Br2, P3, P1-Or, P3-Ye, P1-Or, P3-Ye, P1-Or, P2-Ye, P4-Or, P5-Br1, K2), K13
R32: P13, (K1-Br1, P1, K8, K1-Or, K4-Ye, K1-Or, K3-Ye, K1-Or, K1-Ye, K1-Or, K3-Br2, P1, K1), P12
R33: K2, yo, k2tog, K8, (K3-Br2, P3, P1-Or, P2-Ye, P1-Or, P3-Ye, P1-Or, P1-Ye, P1-Or, P8-Br1, K3 ),
K9, k2tog, yo, K2
R34: P13, (K3-Br1, P1, K8, K8-Or, K3-Br2, P1, K3), P12
R35: K12, (K5, P17, K5), K13 -- <Br2>
R36: P13, (K5, P1, K17, P1, K5), P12 -- <Br2>
R37: K12, (K8, P11, K8), K13 -- <Br2>
R38: P13, (K8, P2, K7, P2, K8), P12 -- <Br2>
R39: Knit
R38-45: Knit
R46: K2, yo, P2tog, K2, P2, K2, P2, cont. to las 4 sts, K2tog, yo, P2
R47-49: Work k2p2 rib.
Bind off.
Finally, knit $\sim 25$ " of 4 -stitch I-cord to wind through the yarn-over holes and attach it to the french press!
