Rook Scarf

For this scarf you will need:

Yarn: 2 or more skeins of worsted to bulky self-striping yarn like Noro Kureyon or SWTC Karaoke. 2 skeins will yield a short scarf, 3-4 skeins will be needed for a more standard length scarf.

Hook: size K

Scarf Width: Gauge is not crucial with this project. Using Noro and following this pattern, you will get a scarf width of approximately 7". When varying the scarf width, make sure you are working across an *odd* number of stitches.

Terms: ch = chain, st = stitch, sc = single crochet, dc = double crochet

The Pattern:

Ch 20 loosely. Work a sc in the back "bump" of each chain across. (19sc's total)

Work Even Rows:

Ch 1, work a sc in each st across. (19 sc)

Repeat the **Work Even Rows** until the color of your yarn has changed. At the beginning of the next row (it doesn't matter which side of the piece because it's reversible), go to **V Row**.

V Row:

Ch 1, *sc in the next st, dc in the space 2 rows below the next st* across, ending the row with a sc.

Go back to **Work Even Rows** until the next color change, then work another **V Row**. Repeat until scarf is desired length.

V Row Illustration: the toothpick is indicating the space into which you dc. (It's 2 rows down and a bit to the left)





Insert hook into this space, draw up a loop of yarn and continue to work a dc as usual.
