



Moebius Basketweave Cowl

A knitting pattern by Staci Perry, www.verypink.com



Just one skein of yarn, a few hours of knitting, and a quick seam!

Size: approximately 40" long (before seaming into a moebius) and 7" wide

Needles: Size 15 US, 24" or 32" circulars

Yarn: One skein of Lion Brand Wool Ease Thick and Quick (a super bulky weight yarn), 106 yards (The colors I used were Cranberry and Charcoal)

Additional Materials: tapestry needle for weaving in ends

Gauge: 2.5 stitches per inch in stockinette

Abbreviations:

BO - bind-off

CO - cast-on

K - knit

P - purl

CO 90 stitches, do not join in-the-round. Just normal rows, knitting back and forth!

Rows 1-5: K5, *P 4, K 4*, repeat between the *s to the last 5 stitches, P 5

Rows 6-10: P 5, *K 4, P 4*, repeat between the *s to the last 5 stitches, K 5

Repeat these 10 rows twice (20 rows total), then BO. (If you leave yourself a couple of feet of tail after the BO, you can use that tail to seam.)

SEAMING

For the best explanation of adding a moebius twist, you'll want to refer to the video. Once you get the twist, use the mattress stitch to seam.

FINISHING

Weave in the tail ends, and either steam or wet block to even out your stitches and make it fabulous.



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
