One size Winter Toque/Beanie

Unvented by Stephanie Rodger 2009

A very stretchy design, this will fit as a babies toque and still fit an adult as a beanie as you can see in the pictures. It is seamless and reversible.

Materials:

Yarn: Patons Canadiana about 50 grm. Needles: 5.5mm circulars or 5 dpns 1 stitch marker Sewing yarn needle to weave in ends.





Abbreviations:

cd = central decrease. Slip next 2 stitches together knitwise, k1 then pass slipped stitches over. ssk = slip the next stitch knitwise, knit the following st and pass the slipped stitch over it.

Pattern:

Cast on 64 sts *loosely* and join in the round distributing sts evenly. Place a marker for start of round. Row 1: (k3, p1) across. Row 2: P1,(k1, p3) to last 3 sts, p2

Repeat rows 1 and 2 for 5.5 inches. (for an adult toque add another 2 or 3 inches.)

Decrease for top of hat:

Row 1: *cd, (p1, k3) 3 times, p1, repeat from * 3 more times (56 sts) Row 2: *k1, p2, (k1,p3) twice, k1, p2, repeat from * 3 more times Row 3: *k1, p2 tog, k2, p1, k3, p1, k2, p2 tog, repeat from * 3 more times (48 sts) Row 4: *k1, k2 tog, p3, k1, p3, ssk, repeat from * 3 more times (40 sts) Row 5: k2, * k1, p1, k3, p1, k1, cd, repeat from * to last st. Slip the last stitch to the first needle and cd this with the first 2 sts of the next row. Place the start of row marker before the st just made.(32 sts) Row 6: *p3, k1, repeat from * to last 3 sts, p3 Row 7: *k2, p1, cd, p1, k1 repeat from * to end of row (24 sts) Row 8: *k1, p1, cd, p1, repeat from * to end of row (16 sts) Row 9: *k1, cd, repeat from * to end of row (8 sts)

Loop yarn over the needle and draw the loop through the remaining sts. Cut the yarn and draw it through the remaining loop. Sew in loose ends.
