# AMIGURUMI CUPCAKE PATTERN

This delicious little treat is as sweet as can be. Try mixing and matching yarn to come up with your favorite flavor!

#### **MATERIALS**

- Small amounts of sport weight yarn in tan, pink or desired colors (see pattern notes for specific yarns used)
- Fiber fill
- 2 6mm plastic doll eyes (optional)
- Size E crochet hook (or size needed to obtain gauge)
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Stitches and abbreviations used in this pattern:

CH chain stitch
SC single crochet
HDC half-double crochet

DECR decrease
ST stitch
STS stitches
MM move marker
FO finish off

For the project shown in the photographs, I used Red Heart Designer Sport yarn in Latte, and Bernat Baby Jacquards in Cherry Berry.

Note: When determining whether to use buttons or other small embellishments, keep in mind the age of the intended recipient. Doll eyes and other decorations may pose a choking hazard for children under three. A safer alternative for the very young is to sew eyes and any other decorations using embroidery thread or yarn.

### **PART 1: CAKE BASE**



The cake portion of the amigurumi cupcake is made in one piece by creating a circle and then bringing the sides up into a cylinder. Beginning with round 13, we will add a small lip to the cake where the icing will sit.

#### **CAKE BASE**

**Round 1:** With cake color, CH 2. 6 SC is second CH from hook. Place a stitch marker in the last SC to designate the end of the round (see figure 1).

Round 2: 2 SC in each SC around. MM to last ST. (12 SC)

**Round 3:** \*2 SC in first SC, SC in next. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (18 SC)

Round 4: \*2 SC in first SC, SC in next two STS. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (24 SC)

Round 5: \*2 SC in first SC, SC in next three STS. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (30 SC)

Round 6: \*2 SC in first SC, SC in next four STS. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (36 SC) The finished base appears as shown in figure 2.

#### **CAKE SIDES**

Round 7: Working in back loops only, 1 SC in each SC around. MM. (36 SC)

Note: Work remaining rounds in both loops

Rounds 8-13: SC in each SC around. MM (36 SC)

Round 14: \*2 SC in first SC, SC in next. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (54 SC)

Round 15: 1 SC in each SC around. MM (54 SC)

Round 16: \*DECR over fist two SC, SC in next. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (36 SC) FO.

Note: See figure 3 for finished cake base.

# **PART 2: ICING**



To make the icing portion of the cupcake, we wil work half-double crochet (HDC) stitches in a spiral. To give my icing a little more texture, I worked in the back loops throughout (see figure 4). If you prefer a smoother icing, work your stitches in both loops.

Round 1: With icing color, CH 2. 6 HDC is second CH from hook. Place a stitch marker in the last HDC to designate the end of the round.

Round 2: 2 HDC in each stitch around.

Round 3: \*2 HDC in first HDC, HDC in next. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (18 HDC)

Round 4: \*2 HDC in first HDC, HDC in next two STS. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (24 HDC)

**Round 5:** \*2 HDC in first HDC, HDC in next three STS. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (30 HDC)

**Round 6:** \*2 HDC in first HDC, HDC in next four STS. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (36 HDC)

**Round 7:** \*2 HDC in first HDC, HDC in next five STS. Repeat around from \* and MM to last ST. (42 HDC) FO.

Note: See figure 5 for finished icing.

## **PART 3: ASSEMBLY**

- 1. Begin by placing your doll eyes on the front side of the cake base, just below the lip crated with rounds 13-15.
- 2. Using a bit of pink yarn and a yarn needle, stitch a smile below the eyes (see figure 6).
- 3. Pinch the icing and the top and bottom sides of the lip (rounds 13 and 15) together
- 4. Using the yarn needle and a piece of icing-colored yarn, begin stitching arond the cake base (see figure 7).

**Tip:** To ensure that your stitches do not show through the bottom of the lip, work only through round 15 of the cake base.

- 6. Continue stitching icing to cake base until about 1 inch remains unstitched (see figure 8).
- 7. Push fiber fill through this oening until the cupcake is sufficiently stuffed.
- 8. Stitch remaining portion closed and finish off.
