Kindle Cozy




Materials:	Hayfield Bonus Aran yarn (I used approx 75yds) Hook size 4mm Large button (3cm diameter)
Finished size: Gauge:	7" x 4.5" 15sts 20 rows = 4" in single crochet
Notes:	I use American crochet terms. Unless specified in the instructions, rounds are worked in a continuous spiral with no joining, turning or turning chains.

I haven't specified a colour pattern for the stripes as I was using up scraps and changing colours as and when I ran out of my tiny balls of yarn.

Starting Chain: 17 stitches.

Round 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 14 ch stitches, 3sc in last ch stitch to turn the corner, 15 sc in back loops of chain, 3sc in final ch stitch (36)



Round 2: sc in back loop of each stitch (36)

Round 3-34: sc in each stitch around (36)

Measure your cozy against your kindle. It should be long enough now to start the flap. If you find yours is too long or short, adjust the number of rows to fit.

Round 35: sc in first 17 stitches, slip stitch into next stitch, ch1, turn

Round 36: sc into sl st, sc 17, ch1, turn

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- Round 44: sc2tog, 5sc, ch4, skip next 4 stitches, 5sc, sc2tog, ch1, turn
- Round 45: sc2tog, 4sc, 4sc into chain, 4sc, sc2tog, ch1, turn
- Round 46: sc2tog, 10sc, sc2tog, ch1, turn
- Round 47: sc2tog, 8sc, sc2tog, ch1, turn
- Round 48: sc2tog, 6sc, sc2tog, ch1, turn
- Round 49: 8sc

Cut yarn, pull through final stitch. Weave in ends.

Slip your kindle back inside and work out the position for your button. It should sit six to seven rounds from the end of the cozy. I used the long yarn tail from my final colour change to sew on the button.

If your kindle is wider than mine, just start with a longer chain!
