

BLANKET MEASUREMENTS

Small 55cm x 80cm Large 85cm x 100cm

Bendigo Woollen Mills Yarn Requirements x 200g Balls

8 Ply Bendigo Tweed, Classic, Luxury, Rustic

Small 3 Large 7

ACCESSORIES

A 80 - 100cm long 4.00mm circular knitting needle or size needle to give correct tension, cable needle.

TENSION

21 sts to 10cm over garter stitch using 4.00mm needles.

Note - Correct tension is not essential for this blanket, however the finished measurements and yarn quantities are based on this tension.

ABBREVIATIONS

C12B = slip 6 sts to cable needle hold in back, (K1, P1) 3 times, work 6 sts in rib from cable needle,

C12F = slip 6 sts to cable needle hold in front, (K1, P1) 3 times, work 6 sts in rib from cable needle,

K = knit, P = purl, patt = pattern, rep = repeat, st/s = stitch/es, tog = together, kfb = knit into front and back of stitch to make a stitch.

BLANKET

Using a 4.00mm circular needle, loosely cast on (using a larger needle if required) 240(384) sts.

1st - 4th Row: *K1, P1 rep from * to end.

5th Row: *C12F, rep from * to end.

6th - 10th Row: As 1st Row.

11th Row: (K1, P1) 3 times, *C12B, rep from * to last 6 sts, (K1, P1) 3 times.

12th Row: As 1st Row.

Rep last 12 rows once more.

25th Row: (K1, P1) 18 times, K2tog to last 36 sts, (K1, P1) 18 times.

156(228) sts.

26th - 28th Row: (K1, P1) 18 times, knit to last 36 sts, (K1, P1) 18 times.

29th Row: C12F 3 times, knit to last 36 sts, C12F 3 times.

30th - 34th Row: (K1, P1) 18 times, knit to last 36 sts, (K1, P1) 18 times.

35th Row: (K1, P1) 3 times, C12B twice, (K1, P1) 3 times, knit to last 36 sts, (K1, P1) 3 times,

C12B twice, (K1, P1) 3 times.

36th Row & 37th Row: (K1, P1) 18 times, knit to last 36 sts, (K1, P1) 18 times.

Cont to work rows 26 to 37 until blanket measures approx 73(93)cm ending with a 36th patt row.

Next Row: (K1, P1) 18 times, kfb to last 36 sts, (K1, P1) 18 times.

240(384)

Rep rows 2 to 12 once, then rows 1 to 12 once.

Cast off loosely (using a larger needle if required).

TO MAKE UP

Sew in ends.

Press lightly with a warm iron and a damp cloth.
