## PICTURE PERFECT FRAMES

A fun addition to a wall, these fancy frames can be filled with precious photos or pretty fabric for a decorative visual interest.

## Skill Level

## Varied

Shell Frame: Beginner - The simplest pattern, using only basic stitches. Sunburst Frame: Easy - An easy pattern, using only basic stitches.
Square Frame: Intermediate - A slightly challenging pattern.
Oval Frame: Tricky - A more complex pattern, using special stitches (details given).

## Materials

YARN

## DMC Natura

$1 \times$ Coral (N18) - YARN A
$1 \times$ Topaze (N19) - YARN B
$1 \times$ Aquamarina (N25) - YARN C
$1 \times$ Gardenia (N36) - YARN D

## Yarn Substitution

You can substitute other weights of yarn, just use one hook size lower than recommend for your yarn. Please note that the fibre content will need to be $100 \%$ cotton to enable you to stiffen the frames with PVA.

## HOOK/NEEDLE

3mm (D US)

## NOTIONS

Yarn needle
Stitch Markers
Pins
A 4 piece of cardboard (approx 1 mm thick)
Small pieces of pretty fabric
PVC Glue or spray starch
Glue gun

## Optional:

An plastic bangle
Compass

## Gauge

Approximately 10 to $15 \mathrm{~cm}\left(4-13^{\prime \prime}\right)$ depending on yarn used.

## Stitch Terms

This pattern is written in UK crochet terms.
US terms are given below to help you translate the pattern:

## Shell Frame

## SKILL LEVEL: BEGINNER

Worked in the round.

With Yarn B, take the plastic bangle and attach yarn, the first row stitches will be made by working over the bangle edge and into the centre of the ring.

TIP: If you don't have a bangle, make 50ch and then sl st into the first ch to form a loop. All stitches for the first row can then be worked into this loop.

Round 1: $1 \mathrm{ch}, 72 \mathrm{dc}$ into the loop, making sure the stitches aren't twisted, make an sl st into the 1 st dc .
(You may need to adjust the number or stitches of round 1 up or down slightly to cover your bangle, just make sure you end up with a number that is a multiple of 6.)

Round 2: 3 ch [counts as 1 tr ], 1 tr into each dc around the circle, sl st into the top of the beg 3ch.

Round 3: (skip 2 sts, 7 tr into next st, skip 2 sts, sl st into next st) repeat this around the circle, ending with a sl st into the starting st.

Cut yarn and weave in ends.

## Sunburst Frame

SKILL LEVEL: EASY

Worked in the round.

Take your cardboard and compass and draw a circle 9 cm across, then a second circle inside the first 6.5 cm across. Cut out the large circle and then the smaller centre circle from inside to leave you with a donut shaped ring.

TIP: If you don't have a compass, try drawing around different size cups or glasses to get the same effect.
With Yarn D, take the cardboard ring and attach yarn, the first row stitches will be made by working over the cardboard edge and into the centre of the ring.

Row 1: 2ch [counts as 1 htr ], 89 htr into the ring, making sure the stitches aren't twisted, make an sl st into the top of the beg 2ch.
(You may need to adjust the number or stitches of round 1 up or down slightly to cover your cardboard ring, just make sure you end up with a number that is a multiple of 3.)

Round 2: $1 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ into same st and into each st around the circle, sl st to the 1 st dc of the round.

Round 3: 1ch, 1 dc in same place, *3ch, skip 2sts, 1 dc into next st,* repeat from * to * around the circle, ending with, 1 ch, skip 2 sts, 1 htr into 1 st dc of the round.

Round 4: 1ch, 1 dc over the htr, *4ch, 1 dc into next 3ch loop,* repeat from * to * around the circle, ending with $1 \mathrm{ch}, 1$ tr, into 1 st dc of the round.

Round 5: 1ch, 1dc over the tr, * 7ch, 1dc into next 4ch loop,* repeat from * to * around the circle, ending with $7 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{sl}$ st into the top of the 1 st dc of the round.

Cut yarn and weave in ends.

## Square Frame

SKILL LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Worked in the round.

With Yarn D, chain 56 and then make a sl st into the 1st ch to make a loop. Then work into the chains as follows:

Round 1: 1ch, 2dc in same place, (1dc in next $13 \mathrm{ch}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch [makes corner]), three times, 1 dc in next $13 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in starting ch, sl st into 1 st dc of the round.

Round 2: 1ch, 2dc in same place, *1dc in each stitch up to middle dc of 3dc that make up corner, 3dc into middle dc,* repeat from * to * around square, ending with 1 dc into the starting st, sl st into 1 st dc of the round.

Round 3: As Round 2.

Cut Yarn D and add in Yarn C the work as follows:

Round 4: As Round 2.

Round 5: 5 ch [counts as 1 tr 2 ch ], 2 tr in same st, ** 1 htr , *1dc, $1 \mathrm{htr}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$, ( $1 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$ ) in next st, $1 \mathrm{tr}, 1 \mathrm{htr}, *$ repeat from * to * two more times, $1 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{htr},(2 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{tr})$ into middle of 3 corner dc's,** repeat from ** to ** twice more, then from * to * three times, 1 tr into starting st, sl st to 3 rd ch of beg ch of 5.

Round 6: sl st into ch sp, 5 ch , sl st into same sp, ** *3ch, skip 2 tr and 1 htr , sl st into dc, 3 ch , skip 1 htr and 2 tr , ( $1 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ ) into $2 \mathrm{ch} \mathrm{sp}, *$ repeat from * to * two more times, 3 ch , skip 2 tr and 1 htr , sl st into dc, 3ch, skip 1 htr and 2 tr , (sl st, $5 \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{sl} \mathrm{st}$ ) into corner sp,** repeat from ${ }^{* *}$ to ** three more times, ending last repeat with an sl st into the starting ch sp .

Cut yarn and weave in all ends.

## Oval Frame

SKILL LEVEL: TRICKY

Worked in the round.

With Yarn A, chain 60 and then make a sl st into the 1 st ch to make a loop. Then work into the chains as follows:

Round 1: 1ch, 1 dc in same place, 1 dc in next $4 \mathrm{ch}, * 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch, ( 1 dc in next $3 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch) six times,* 1dc in next 5 ch, repeat from * to * again, sl st into 1 st dc of the round.

Round 2: $1 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in same place, 1 dc in next 7 sts, *2dc in next ch, ( 1 dc in next $4 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch) five times,* 1 dc in next 11 ch, repeat from * to * again, 1 dc in next 3 ch , sl st into 1 st dc of the round.

Round 3: 1ch, 1dc in same place, 1 dc in next $17 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st, mp, 1 dc in next $5 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st, 1 dc in next 18 sts, ( $3 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in next 3 sts) three times, pm in last dc made, 1 dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in next st, 1 htr in next 2 sts, 1 tr in next 6 sts, 1 htr in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, 1 dc in next 4 sts, pm in last dc made, 1 dc in next 3 sts, (3ch, 1dc in ext 3 sts) twice, 3 ch , sl st into 1 st dc of the round.

Cut yarn and with RS still facing, re-attach yarn to st indicated by the first marker, then work as follows:

Row 4: 1 dc in next st, $3 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ in next 2 sts, 3 ch , skip $1,1 \mathrm{dc}$ in next 2 sts, 4 ch , skip $1,1 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{htr}, 5 \mathrm{ch}, 1 \mathrm{tr}$ in next 2 sts, mp, 1tr in next 2 sts, 5ch, 1htr, 1dc, 4ch, skip 1, 1dc in next 2 sts, 3ch, skip 1, 1dc in next 2 sts, 3ch, 1 dc sl st into next st [indicated with second marker].

Cut yarn and weave in all ends.

## Finishing

For all frames, pin out to shape face down on a protected surface and then either coat with PVA glue or spray with starch to stiffen. Leave to dry over night. If using starch, you may need to repeat the process with the front of the frames.

Using the stiffened frame as a guide, trace the inner shape of the frame onto cardboard, then draw a second line approximately 1 cm outside this inner shape. Cut out the shape using this outer line. Check the size by holding the backing piece against the frame and trim the edges back a little if necessary so they won't show from the front. Cover the cardboard backing piece with a fabric of your choice and then, using a glue gun, stick the cardboard backing to the frame.

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
