A Guided Design Crochet Pattern


## FREE Crochet Pattern



Use:
$5.0 \mathrm{~mm}(\mathrm{H})$ crochet hook
Big Twist premium yarn in
Premium Snow (Medium (4) or worsted weight yarn)

Embellishment as you would like (I used a button and purple yarn)

Tapestry needle (to sew in ends)
Sewing needle (to sew on button)
Locking stitch marker (to mark the beginning of each round)

Abbreviations (US Terms):

| $\mathrm{ch}=$ | chain | hhdc = | herringbone half double |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| st(s) = | stitch(es) |  | crochet |
| sl st = | slip stitch | $d \mathrm{c}=$ | double crochet |
| ea $=$ | each | \# rep = | number of times to repeat the instructions in |
| FLO = | front loop only |  | parentheses |
| SC $=$ | single crochet |  |  |

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Instructions:

| Round | \# of sts | Instructions |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 1 | 8 | 8sc in a magic circle <br> Tighten circle <br> Join with sl st, ch 1 <br> For rounds 2 to 10 , do not join at the end of each round (continue working in rounds) <br> Use a locking stitch marker to mark the first stitch of each round, to ensure you don't lose count |
| 2 | 16 | 2 hhdc in ea st around |
| 3 | 16 | 1 hhdc in ea st around |
| 4-10 | 16 | Repeat Round 3 |

Hand portion of mitten complete. Now, we move onto creating cuff of mitten.
You will be joining with a sl st at the end of each round.

| 11 | 16 | 1 sc in FLO of ea st around, Join with sl st in first sc of round, ch 2 |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 12 | 16 | 1 dc in ea st around Join, ch 2 |
| 13 | 16 | $d c$ in $1^{\text {st }}$ st, fpdc in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{dc}$ (dc, fpdc) 7rep Join, ch2 |
| 14 | 16 | Repeat Round 13 Join, ch 1 |
| 15 | 16 | 1 sc in ea st around Fasten off |

* Add embellishments as you would like. I added a button to the cuff of each mitten.
