# "Cute as a Button" Baby Mittens



A Guided Design Crochet Pattern

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FREE Crochet Pattern



## Use:

5.0mm (H) crochet hook

Big Twist premium yarn in Premium Snow (Medium (4) or worsted weight yarn)

Embellishment as you would like (I used a button and purple yarn)

Tapestry needle (to sew in ends)

Sewing needle (to sew on button)

Locking stitch marker (to mark the beginning of each round)

## Abbreviations (US Terms):

ch = chain

st(s) = stitch(es)

sl st = slip stitch

ea = each

FLO = front loop only

sc = single crochet

hhdc = herringbone half double  
crochet

dc = double crochet

# rep = number of times to repeat  
the instructions in  
parentheses

## Instructions:

Round	# of sts	Instructions
1	8	8sc in a magic circle Tighten circle Join with sl st, ch 1 For rounds 2 to 10, do not join at the end of each round (continue working in rounds) Use a locking stitch marker to mark the first stitch of each round, to ensure you don't lose count
2	16	2 hhdc in ea st around
3	16	1 hhdc in ea st around
4 - 10	16	Repeat Round 3
<b>Hand portion of mitten complete. Now, we move onto creating cuff of mitten. You will be joining with a sl st at the end of each round.</b>		
11	16	1sc in FLO of ea st around, Join with sl st in first sc of round, ch 2
12	16	1 dc in ea st around Join, ch 2
13	16	dc in 1 <sup>st</sup> st, fpdc in 2 <sup>nd</sup> dc (dc, fpdc) 7rep Join, ch2
14	16	Repeat Round 13 Join, ch1
15	16	1 sc in ea st around Fasten off

\* Add embellishments as you would like. I added a button to the cuff of each mitten.
