### CROCHET FROG EAR SAVER PATTERN





#### **MATERIALS:**

\*\*\*You can use any worsted weight/ cat. 4 yarns, but COTTON IS THE BEST FOR REPEATED HOT WASHING! (I just couldn't get any so the yarns I used are acrylic)\*\*\*
\*Red Heart Super Saver Yarn

-Tea Leaf (MC) - 25 yards

\*Caron Simply Soft (or any THIN ww yarn)

-Black - Small amount

-White - Scraps

\*Sewing needle with large eye

\*2 Black Buttons (preferably 7/8" or 1")

#### **HELPFUL NOTES**

<sup>\*</sup>To make your ear savers larger or smaller than mine (The buttons are about 5" apart on mine) you can adjust your hook size up or down after matching my gauge.

<sup>\*</sup>After a chain or turning chain you will always work next stitch in same stitch as chain unless otherwise indicated.

<sup>\*</sup>When the pattern says "join" it means to join with a slip stitch in the top of the beginning stitch of round or row

<sup>\*</sup>When you see \*\* followed by a number, that is indicating the number of stitches you should have done in that row or round. Chains & slip stitches do not count in this total.

<sup>\*</sup>Instructions within brackets [] are a set and need to be done the total number of times indicated after the brackets. A set also can be done all in one stitch if indicated after the brackets.

<sup>\*</sup>If you are not familiar with a magic loop (magic circle) then you can start with a ch 2 and SC the indicated number of sts in 2nd ch from hook. Or you can refer to YouTube tutorials.

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#### **BASE** — Use **MC** and G hook.

Begin with Ch 16

Rnd 1: SC in second ch from hook, SC in next 3 sts, HDC in next 7 sts, SC in next 3 sts, 3 SC in last st (turning chain clockwise and working around to the opposite side of the chain), SC in next 3 sts, HDC in next 7 sts, SC in next 3 sts, 2 SC in last st, join \*\*32 sts

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 SC in first st, SC in next 4 sts, HDC in next 5 sts, SC in next 4 sts, 2 SC in next 3 sts, SC in next 4 sts, HDC in next 5 sts, SC in next 4 sts, 2 SC in last 2 sts, join \*\*38 sts

Rnd 3: Ch 1, 2 SC in first st, SC in next 16 sts, 2 SC in each of next 3 sts, SC in next 16 sts, 2 SC in each of last 2 sts, join \*\*44 sts

Rnd 4: Ch 1, 2 SC in first st, SC in next 19 sts, 2 SC in each of next 3 sts, SC in next 19 sts, 2 SC in each of last 2 sts, join \*\*50 sts

Rnd 5: Ch 1, SC in first 22 sts, 2 SC in each of next 3 sts, SC in next 22 sts, 2 SC in each of last 3 sts, join \*\*56 sts

Finish off and hide end.

#### EYE CIRCLES (Make 2) - Use G hook & MC

Rnd 1: Begin with a magic loop of 8 SC, join \*\*8 sts


Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 SC in each st around, join \*\*16 sts

Rnd 3: Ch 1, SC in first st, [2 SC in next st, SC in next st] 7 times, SC in last st, join \*\*24 sts.

Finish off leaving tail for sewing

### **ASSEMBLY**

**STEP 1**: Sew eye circles to the top end of each side of your base. They should overlap 2 rounds of the base. You will sew along the front with a backstitch (See Figure A) and along the back with a whipstitch (See Figure B).



**STEP 2:** Place a button in the center of each eye circle and sew down with white yarn (it looks best if you turn your button so you are creating an up and down cross and not an x. Sew securely, but not too tight up against the yarn so the elastics from masks can fit under the buttons (See Figure C).



**STEP 3**: Use black yarn to chain stitch on a smile and put a straight stitch across the left end (See Figure C).
