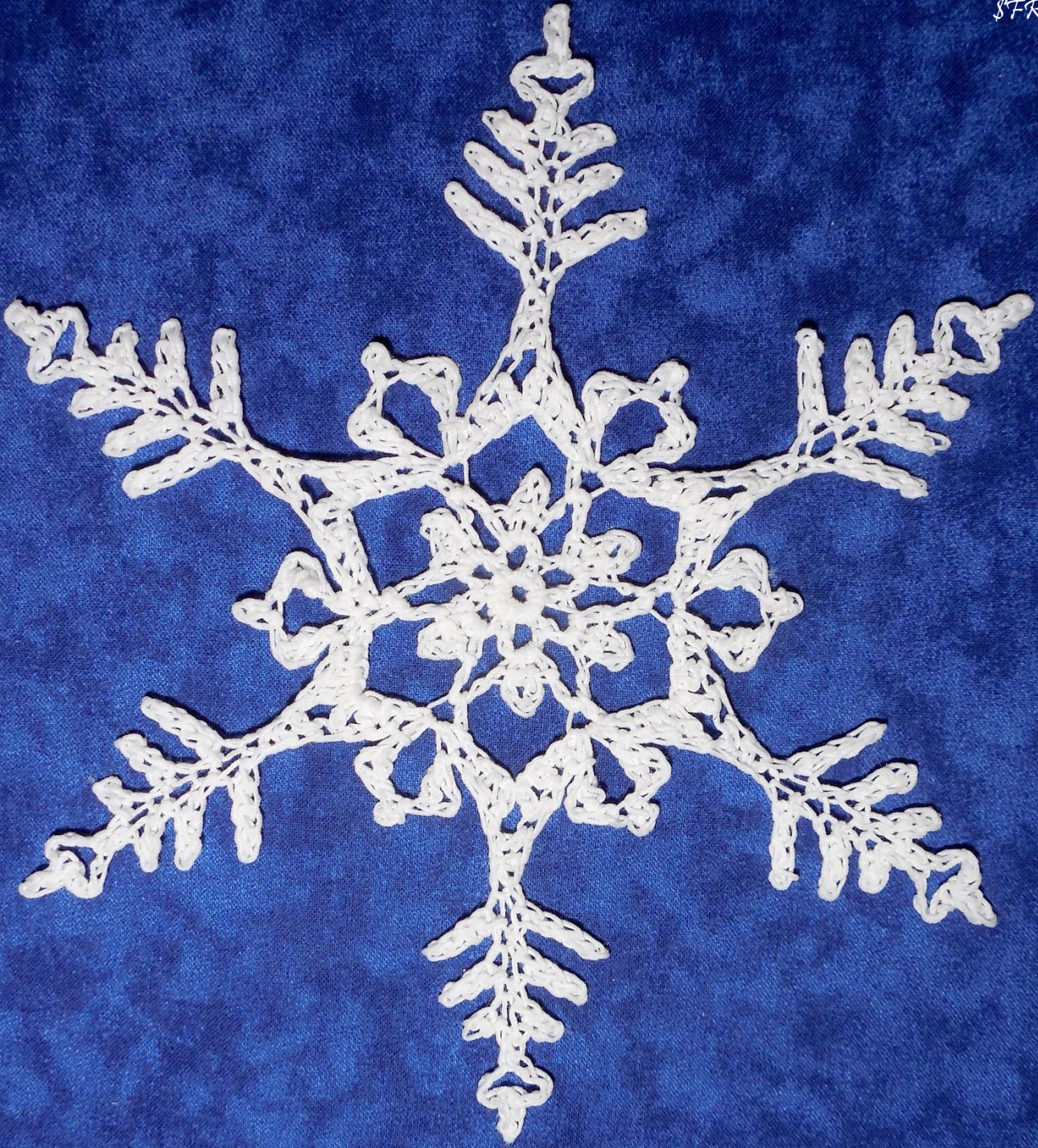




# Let's Make a Snowflake!

**SKILL LEVEL:**

Intermediate

**FINISHED SIZE:**

7" diameter

**MATERIALS:**

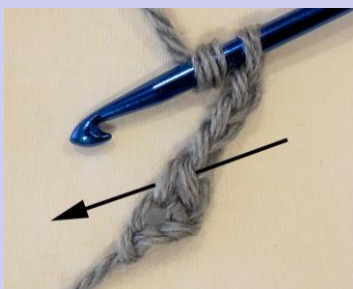
- White cotton crochet thread, size 10\*
- Size 8 (1.50 mm) crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- Foam core board or blocking mat
- Plastic wrap
- Re-closeable plastic bag
- Fabric stiffener or white glue
- Paper towel
- Rust-proof straight pins

**ABBREVIATIONS:**

beg ..... beginning  
 ch(s) ..... chain(s)  
 dc ..... double crochet  
 hdc ..... half double crochet  
 lp ..... loop  
 rem ..... remaining  
 rep ..... repeat  
 rnd ..... round  
 sc ..... single crochet  
 sk ..... skip  
 sl st(s) ..... slip stitch(es)  
 sp ..... space  
 st(s) ..... stitch(es)

**SPECIAL STITCHES:**

st *in center of sc* – work indicated st by inserting hook thru one horizontal bar and one vertical bar of sc (see photo for placement)



\* DMC Baroque 100% Crochet Cotton in White was used for model.

**Begin:**

Ch 5, join with sl st to form ring.

**Rnd 1:**

Ch 1, sc in ring, (ch 3, sc in ring) 5 times, join with dc in beg sc.

*Joining-dc counts as ch-3 sp.*

**Rnd 2:**

Ch 1, \*[sc in ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc *in center of sc* just made, sc in same ch-3 sp – *picot made*], † ch 4, sk sc,\* rep from \* to \* 4 times, then from \* to † once, ch 1, join with dc in beg sc.

*Ch 1 + joining-dc counts as ch-4 sp.*

**Rnd 3:**

Ch 1, \*sc in ch-4 sp, ch 7, sk picot,\* rep from \* to \* around, join with sl st in beg sc.

**Rnd 4:**

Beg in same st as sl st just made, ch 1,

- \*sc in sc, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch from hook, ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch from hook, sc in same sc as beg sc of *this step*,
- sk 1st ch of ch-7 sp, sc in next ch, hdc in next, dc in next,
- ch 8, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 3 ch,
- ch 5, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 2 ch,
- ch 4, sl st in 2nd and 3rd chs from hook,

- ch 8, sl st in 2nd and 3rd chs from hook, ch 3, sk next 3 ch, sl st in each of rem 2 ch,
- ch 3, sl st in 2nd and 3rd chs from hook, sl st in rem ch of *step e*,
- ch 4, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each of rem 2 ch, sl st in rem ch of *step d*,
- ch 5, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each of rem 3 ch, working in rem 3 ch of *step c*, sl st in next ch, sc in next, hdc in next,
- dc in same ch as last dc made in *step b*, working in rem ch of ch-7 sp, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, sk last ch,

rep from \* to \* (*steps a to j*) around, join with sl st in beg sc. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

**STIFFENING**

Cover foam core board with plastic wrap. Put a small amount of fabric stiffener (or 1:1 mixture of white glue and water) in re-closeable plastic bag. Saturate snowflake in fabric stiffener. Remove snowflake and blot excess fabric stiffener with paper towel. Pin to plastic-covered foam core board in desired shape using rust-proof straight pins. Allow to dry completely before removing from board.
