

A cabled neckwarmer by KnotMagick Studios



Sample shown in Berocco Pima 100.

Materials:

50g worsted yarn (either one color or 25g each of 2 colors) US 5 needles (circular or double point) Tapestry/yarn needle Gauge: 4in/10cm=24sts/25 rows Finished dimensions: 20in/51cm circumference x 6.75in/17cm length

Abbreviations:

CO: Cast on STS: stitches P: Purl K: Knit CB: Slip next stitch to cable needle and hold to back KCN: Knit 1 from cable needle This pattern can be worked in one color or two, like the sample. The pattern is written for one color, with instructions for the two-color adaption at the end.

The pattern as written is for a rather snug fitting neck warmer. If you prefer a slouchier fit, add stitches in multiples of 8.



To begin:

CO 120 sts. Join in the round without twisting and work in stockinette stitch for 6 rounds.

Round 7: fold the cast on edge up into the inside of the cowl. Insert the right hand needle into the first stitch on the left hand needle AND into the cast on edge before knitting as usual. Repeat this all the way around making sure this round is somewhat loose, as it will lack elasticity. Round 8: knit.

If you have difficulty with round 7, it is perfectly acceptable to skip it, then fold the cast on edge up and whip stitch it in place once the rest of the cowl is done. The same thing can be done with the cast off edge.

Body:

Rounds 1-3: *K4, p1, k2, p1. Repeat from star all the way around. Round 4: *K4, p1, CN, KCN, P1. Repeat from star all the way around. Repeat these 4 rounds 10 times or until cowl reaches desired length.

Finishing:

Knit 7 rounds in stockinette. Turn the cowl inside out, folding over this stockinette edge. Cast off, catching a stitch from the first stockinette round with every cast off stitch to create a fold over edge.



Cut working yarn and weave in ends.

Two color version:

For the two color version pictured, cast on with the contrast color. Work the beginning portion in the contrast color, the purl stitches in the body, and the finishing portions. Floats should not be too tight, especially on cable rows.
