Amigurumi Tiny Tom Turkey

Materials Needed:

Size 2.75 mm crochet hook Poly-fill stuffing 6 mm black safety eyes Scissors Yarn needle Stitch marker (optional)

Yarn:

Yarn and Colors: Epic (A 100% cotton aran weight yarn) Satay 026: 11g (brown) Sorbus 019: 1g (orange) Sunflower 014: 1g (yellow) Pepper 032: 1g (red)

OR

Any 100% acrylic yarn in worsted/aran weight yarn. If you use the recommended amount for the cotton yarn, you should have enough plus some extra because cotton yarn tends to weigh more than acrylic.

Finished Size:

If the recommended yarn thickness and hook size are used the finished amigurumi will be approximately 6 cm (2.3 inches) tall by 9 cm (3.5 inches) wide (including the tail).

Abbreviations: Pattern is in US Crochet Terms

ch: chain stitch
slst: slip stitch
st: stitch

sc: single crochet

(*): when you see instructions written between parenthesis you will work these instructions as many times

as the pattern tells you to.

inc: single crochet increase
dec: single crochet decrease

slst: slip stitch
rnd: round

Designer Note:

When I crochet amigurumi I let the wrong side face outwards. All the photos you will see in this tutorial are worked this way and it is my personal preference when it comes to making amigurumi. If you choose to crochet with the traditional right side facing outwards there will be no significant difference regarding how the finished piece will turn out so, feel free to crochet this amigurumi however you like.

Body (make 1, in satay yarn)

Rnd 1: start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

Rnd 2: inc 5 times [10]

Rnd 3: (inc, 2 sc) 3 times, sc in last st [13]

Rnd 4: (inc, 3 sc) 3 times, sc in last st [16]

Rnd 5 - 7: 16 sc [16]

Rnd 8: (inc, 3 sc) 4 times [20]

Rnd 9: (inc, 4 sc) 4 times [24]

Rnd 10: 24 sc [24]

Eyes: Place eyes between rnds 3 - 4 with 4 st between

them.

Note: Stuff with fiberfill and continue stuffing as you go.

Rnd 11: (dec, 3 sc) 4 times, dec, sc in last 2 st [19]

Rnd 12: (dec, 2 sc) 4 times, dec, sc in last st. [14]

Rnd 13: (dec, sc) 4 times, sc in last 2 st [10]

Rnd 14: dec 5 times [5]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining st and pull it tight to close.

Beak (in sunflower yarn)

Attach your yarn to a stitch between the eyes and sc 2 times. Turn the amigurumi sideways so you can slip stitch once directly under the two sts you just made. Fasten off and carefully weave in yarn tails. Pulling too hard can ruin the shape of the beak.

Feet (in sunflower yarn)

Cut a long piece of sunflower yarn and sc 3 times across into the lower front part of body where you want the first foot to be. The center of each foot should be directly under the eye on that side.

Take the yarn end and thread it through the body 2-3 sts to the left, where you want the second foot to begin. Sc 3 times and fasten off. Weave in all yarn ends.

Wattle (in pepper yarn)

Ch 6.

Row 1: slst into the second st from the hook, 4 slst [5]

Fasten off and sew the wattle to the top of the beak so that it lays to one side.

Wings (make 2, in satay yarn)

Ch 5.

Row 1: 2 hdc in 3rd ch from hook, 2 sc [4]

Fasten off and sew the wings to the side of the turkey about 2-3 sts below and 1 st behind the placement of the eyes.

Tail (make 1, starting in satay yarn)

Ch 6, with a long tail for sewing later.

Row 1: 5 sc; ch 1, turn [5]

Row 2: inc, 3 sc, inc; ch 1, turn [7]

Row 3: inc, 5 sc, inc; ch 1, turn [9]

Row 4: inc, 7 sc, inc; ch 1, turn [11]

(change to sunflower yarn)

Row 5: inc, 9 sc, inc; ch 1, turn [13]

(change to sorbus yarn)

Row 6: (sc, ch 3, sc into the same st) 13 times for a total

of 13 "feather bumps"

Fasten off, sew row 1 of the tail to the lower back of the turkey. Then also sew row 3 of the tail to the turkey's back, so that the tail doesn't flop over.

Your Tiny Tom Turkey is now complete!
