Materials Needed:

Worsted weight yarn:

Light Blue

Poly-fill stuffing

6mm black safety eyes

Equipment Needed:

Size 2.75mm Crochet Hook

Scissors

Yarn needle

Stitch marker (optional)

Abbreviations: Pattern is in US Crochet Terms

ch: chain stitch

st: stitch

sc: single crochet

(*): when you see instructions written between parenthesis you will work these instructions as many times

as the pattern tells you to.

inc: single crochet increase

dec: single crochet decrease

slst: slip stitch **FO:** fasten off

Designer Note:

When I crochet amigurumi I let the wrong side face outwards. All the photos you will see in this tutorial are worked this way and it is my personal preference when it comes to making amigurumi. If you choose to crochet with the traditional right side facing outwards there will be no significant difference regarding how the finished piece will turn out so feel free to crochet this amigurumi however you like.

Head (in light blue yarn)

Rnd 1: start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: inc 6 times [12]

Rnd 3: (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

Rnd 4: (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

Rnd 5: (inc, sc in next st) repeat 3 times, sc in next 6 st,

(inc, sc in next st) repeat 3 times [30]

Rnd 6-11: sc in all 30 st [30]

Rnd 12: (dec, sc in next st) repeat 3 times, sc in next 6

st, (dec, sc in next st) repeat 3 times [24]

Eyes: places eyes between rnds 10 and 11 with 9 spaces between the eyes.

Rnd 13: (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

Rnd 14: (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Note: start stuffing the head and continue stuffing as you go.

Note: Do NOT fasten off yet, instead continue on to the body's instructions. (Fig. 1)

Body (in light blue yarn)

Rnd 1: (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

Rnd 2: sc in all 18 st [18]

Rnd 3: (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

Rnd 4-6: sc in all 24 st [24]

Rnd 7: (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

Rnd 8: (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Rnd 9: dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. (Fig. 2)

Arms (make 2 in light blue yarn)

Rnd 1: start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]

Rnd 2: inc 4 times [8] **Rnd 3:** sc in all 8 st [8]

Rnd 4: (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 2 times [6]

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. (Fig. 3) Lightly stuff the arms with stuffing and sew them onto the body. (Fig. 4)

Legs (make 2 in light blue yarn)

Rnd 1: start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

Rnd 2: inc 5 times [10]

Rnd 3: (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 2 times [8]

Rnd 4: (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 2 times [6]

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. Lightly stuff the legs with stuffing and sew them onto the body.

Tail (in light blue yarn)

Rnd 1: start 3 sc in a magic ring [3]

Rnd 2: inc 3 times [6]

Rnd 3: sc in all 6 st [6]

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. Lightly stuff the tail with stuffing and sew it onto the body. (Fig. 5)

Ears (make 2 in light blue yarn)

Rnd 1: start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]

Rnd 2: inc 4 times [8]

Rnd 3: sc in all 8 st [8]

Rnd 4: (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 2 times [6]

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. Do not stuff the ears. Sew ears on top of the head. (Fig. 6)
