

## Doppelt Hat and Mitts

A knitting pattern by Staci Perry, www.verypink.com


## Getting Started

Size: Women's average (for a slightly larger or smaller fit, use a larger or smaller needle size)
Needles: Size US 4 ( 3.5 mm ) and US 5 ( 3.75 mm ) circular needles, $16^{\prime \prime}$ (or longer if you prefer to use magic loop), size US 5 ( 3.75 mm ) double-pointed needles for the crown of the hat and the mitts
Yarn: KPC Glencoul DK ( $70 \%$ merino, $30 \%$ cotton), details on amounts and colors below
Additional Materials: cable needle, tapestry needle for weaving ends
Gauge: 6 stitches and 8.5 rows per inch $(2.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ in stockinette

## Yarn amounts for both hat and mitts:

7 balls of Glencoul DK total
Thunder-3 balls
Wicker - 1 ball
Pear Drop - 1 ball
Lagoon-1 ball
Mist - 1 ball

## Abbreviations:

BO - bind-off
CO - cast-on
DPNs - double pointed needles
K - knit
K2tog - knit two stitches together
KFB - knit front/back, one stitch increase
LT (left twist): Slip the next knit stitch to cable needle and hold in front of work, P the next stitch, K the stitch from the cable needle
M1 - Make 1, one stitch increase (you can work a right or left M1, doesn't matter)
M1L - Make 1 Left
M1R - Make 1 Right
P - purl
PM - place marker
RS - right side
RT (right twist): Slip next purl stitch to cable needle and hold in back of work, $K$ the next stitch, $P$ the stitch from the cable needle

## Directions, Cap

Using US 5 ( 3.75 mm ) DPNs, cast-on 6 stitches over 3 needles ( 2 stitches each needle). Join in the round.
Round 1: K (6 sts)
Round 2: KFB around (12 sts)
Round 3: K
Round 4: KFB around (24 sts)
Round 5: K (you can place a clippie marker to mark the beginning of the round at this point)
Round 6: *K1, KFB*, repeat between *s around (36 sts)
Round 7: K
Round 8: *K2, KFB*, repeat between *s around (48 sts)
Round 9: K
Round 10: *K3, KFB*, repeat between *s around (60 sts)
Rounds 11 \& 12: K
Round 13: *K4, KFB*, repeat between *s around (72 sts)
Rounds 14 \& 15: $K$
Round 16: *K5, KFB*, repeat between *s around (84 sts)
Rounds 17 \& 18: K (you can switch to $16^{\prime \prime}$ circulars on Round 18)
Round 19: *K6, KFB*, repeat between *s around (96 sts)
Rounds 20 \& 21: K
Round 22: *K7, KFB*, repeat between *s around (108 sts)
Round 23-28: K
Rounds 29-64: Work the striped color chart (below)

Rounds 65-67: K
Rounds 68-73: P1, *K2, P2*, repeat between *s to last 3 stitches, K2, P1
Round 74 (bottom edge of caps): $P$

That is the first cap, finished!

Ribbing
Round 1: Switch to size US 4 needles (3.5mm) and using Thunder (gray) yarn, *K9, M1*, repeat between *s around (120 sts)
Rounds 2-12: K1, *P2, K2*, repeat between *s to last 3 stitches, P2, K1
Round 13-15: Switch to size US 5 ( 3.75 mm ) needles, *P3, K2, P3*, repeat between *s to end of round

Trellis Wallpaper Pattern
Rounds 1 \& 3: *P3, K2, P3*, repeat between *s around
Round 2 and all even-numbered rounds: Purl the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back
Round 5: *P2, RT, LT, P2*, repeat between *s around
Round 7: *P1, RT, P2, LT, P1*, repeat between *s around
Round 9: *RT, P4, LT*, repeat between ${ }^{*}$ s around
Round 11 \& 13: *K1, P6, K1*, repeat between *s around
Round 15: *LT, P4, RT*, repeat between *s around
Round 17: *P1, LT, P2, RT, P1*, repeat between *s around
Round 19: *P2, LT, RT, P2*, repeat between *s around
Round 20: Repeat Round 2
Repeat Rounds 1-20 once more (40 rounds total)

If you haven't secured the ends inside yet - now is the time!
Cabled Hat Crown
Rounds 1 \& 3: *P3, K2, P3*, repeat between *s around
Rounds 2 and all even-numbered rounds unless noted with an asterisk below (Rounds 22, 24, 26): Purl the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back
Round 5: *P2, K2tog, SSK, P2*, repeat between *s around
Round 7: *P1, RT, LT, P1*, repeat between *s around
Round 9: *RT, P2, LT*, repeat between *s around
Round 11: *SSK, P2, K2tog*, repeat between *s around
Rounds 13 \& 15: *K1, P2, K1*, repeat between *s around
Round 17: *LT, RT*, repeat between *s around
Round 19: *P1, K2, P1*, repeat between *s around
Round 21: *K2tog, SSK*, repeat between *s around
*Rounds 22 and 23: K
*Round 24: *K2tog*, repeat between *s around
Round 25: K
*Round 26: *SL1, K2tog, PSSO*, repeat between *s around (5 stitches)
Break yarn, and run the end through the remaining stitches. Tighten and secure, pulling the end inside the hat.

## Directions, Mitts

Using Thunder (gray) yarn and size US 5 (3.75mm) DPNs, cast-on 44 stitches over three needles as follows: 15 stitches on first needle, 15 stitches on second needle, 14 stitches on third needle.

## BOTH MITTS - CUFF

(Note - the stitches inside the parentheses are/will be the cable stitches)
Rounds 1-12: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P3, K2, P3), K1, *P2, K2*, repeat between *s to end of round
Round 13: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P3, K2, P3), K1, P2, K2, P2, K21, M1, K1 (45 stitches)

## BOTH MITTS - CABLED SECTION

Rounds 1 \& 3: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P3, K2, P3), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 2 and all even-numbered rounds: $P 2, K 2, P 2, K 1,(P$ the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in
back), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 5: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P2, RT, LT, P2), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 7: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P1, RT, P2, LT, P1), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 9: P2, K2, P2, K1, (RT, P4, LT), KK1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 11 \& 13: P2, K2, P2, K1, (K1, P6, K1), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 15: P2, K2, P2, K1, (LT, P4, RT), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 17: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P1, LT, P2, RT, P1), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 19: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P2, LT, RT, P2), K1, P2, K2, P2, K23
Round 20: Repeat Round 2
After you work these 20 rounds, work Rounds $1-10$ again, then continue with "Right Mitt" or "Left Mitt".

## RIGHT MITT

Round 11: work first 22 stitches of cable pattern above, PM, M1R, K1, M1L, PM, K to end Continue with the cable pattern above, and work the Increase Round below on the following rounds: 14, 17, 20 (start cabled rounds over again), 3, 6, 9. You will have 15 thumb stitches between the markers. On non-increase rows, just knit the thumb stitches between the markers.

Increase round: Work in pattern as established to marker, SM, M1R, $K$ to next marker, M1L, SM, $K$ to end
Round 10: P2, K2, P2, K1, ( P the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back), K1, P2, K2, P2, K to end
Round 11: P2, K2, P2, K1, (K1, P6, K1), K1, P2, K2, P2, K to end
Round 12: P2, K2, P2, K1, ( P the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back), K1, P2, K2, P2, remove the marker, slip the stitches between the marker onto a piece of scrap yarn to reserve the stitches, remove second marker, use the backwards loop cast-on to CO one stitch on right needle, K to end.
Rounds 13-19: Work cabled pattern
Round 20: P2, K2, P2, K1, ( P the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back), K1, P2, K2, P2, K to last 2 stitches, K2tog (44 stitches)
Continue with "Both Mitts" below.

## LEFT MITT

Round 11: P2, K2, P2, K1, (K1, P6, K1), K1, P2, K2, P2, K22, PM, M1R, K1, M1L, PM (the second marker isn't really necessary - it is the end of the round and will just fall off the end of the needle if you're working with DPNs.) :) Continue with the cable pattern above, and work the Increase Round below on the following rounds: 14, 17, 20 (start cabled rounds over again), 3, 6, 9. You will have 15 thumb stitches between the markers. On non-increase rows, just knit the thumb stitches between the markers.

Increase round: Work in pattern as established to marker, SM, M1R, K to end of round, M1L
Round 10: P2, K2, P2, K1, ( P the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back), $\mathrm{K} 1, \mathrm{P} 2, \mathrm{~K} 2, \mathrm{P} 2, \mathrm{~K}$ to end
Round 11: P2, K2, P2, K1, (K1, P6, K1), K1, P2, K2, P2, $K$ to end
Round 12: P2, K2, P2, K1, ( P the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back), K1, P2, $\mathrm{K} 2, \mathrm{P} 2, \mathrm{~K}$ to marker, remove the marker, slip the stitches between the marker onto a piece of scrap yarn to reserve the stitches, remove second marker if necessary, use the backwards loop cast-on to CO one stitch on right needle
Rounds 13-19: Work cabled pattern
Round 20: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P the purl stitches and slip the knit stitches with the yarn in back), K1, P2, K2, P2, K to last 2 stitches, K2tog (44 stitches)
Continue with "Both Mitts" below.

## BOTH MITTS - TOP RIBBING

## Top Rib

Rounds 1-8: P2, K2, P2, K1, (P3, K2, P3), K1, *P2, K2*, repeat between *s to end of round BO normally using a size 6 needle (one size larger)

## BOTH MITTS, THUMB

Slip 15 reserved thumb stitches over three needles (5 stitches each needle).
Reattach yarn at the base of the thumb, and work around all three needles, then pick up and knit one stitch at the base of the thumb, 16 stitches.

Continue around, keeping count of your rounds so you can make the second mitt to match. The length you make the thumb really depends on how long you would like it, and the natural length of your thumb. For my mitts, I knit 8 rounds. Bind off using the Simple Stretchy Bind-Off. Simple Stretchy Bind-Off video here:

It is normal to see a gap between the thumb and the mitt - any time you change direction in your knitting, there can be a gap in the stitches. When you weave in the end at the base of the thumb, you can stitch any gaps closed as you weave in the end.
