



# Double-Thick Cuff Hat

## Getting Started.

**Sizes:** Small/Medium and Medium/Large (the cuff is very stretchy, S/M will fit most women, and M/L will fit most men)

**Needles:** Size US 6 (4.0mm) 16" circulars, a second set of circulars in any length in the same size or smaller, US 6 double-pointed needles

**Yarn:** 2 colors of DK weight yarn, 50 grams each color (details on the yarn I used below)

**Additional Materials:** Five ring stitch markers, tapestry needle for weaving ends

**Gauge:** 6 stitches per inch

The yarn I used Knit Picks Capra in Magnolia and Blush. The yarn I used in the worsted-weight hat is Knit Picks Wool of the Andes Tweed in Papaya Heather and Oyster Heather.

### Abbreviations:

CO - cast-on

DPNs - double pointed needles

K - knit

K2tog - knit two stitches together

P - purl  
PM - place marker  
SSK - slip, slip, knit decrease

## Directions.

In the directions below, if two numbers appear, the first number is for the smaller size, the second number is for the larger size.

### DOUBLE CUFF

Using a crocheted provisional cast-on and scrap yarn, CO 104 (116) stitches. Using your cuff color and starting at the slip knot end, knit across these stitches. Place marker and join in the round, and work K2, P2 rib until piece measures 4.5" (12cm). (This was 32 rounds for me.) Break cuff color.

Unzip the provisional cast-on to your second circular needle and fold the cuff in half as demonstrated in the video. Using second color, knit one together from the front needle with one together from the back needle until all of the stitches are joined. Knit every round until entire piece measures 7" (18cm).

### CROWN DECREASES

#### Smaller Size Setup

Round 1: K 20, pm, \*K 21, pm\*, repeat between \*s to end of round

Round 2: K to two stitches before marker, k2tog, \*SSK, K to two stitches before marker, k2tog\* repeat between \*s to end of round, 95 stitches (19 stitches between each marker)

Round 3: Knit

Continue with "Both Sizes" below.

#### Larger Size Setup

Round 1: SSK, K 22, pm, \*K 23, pm\*, repeat between \*s to end of round, 115 stitches (23 stitches between each marker)

Round 2: Knit

Continue with "Both Sizes" below.

#### Both Sizes

Switch to DPNs when there are too few stitches to fit around your needles, I switched to DPNs at 55 stitches (11 stitches between each marker).

Round 1: \*SSK, K to two stitches before marker, k2tog\* repeat between \*s to end of round, 10 stitches decreased.

Round 2: Knit

Repeat these two rounds 8 (10) times, 16 (20) rounds total. 15 stitches remain, 3 stitches between each of the markers.

Next Round: k3tog around, removing markers (5 stitches)

Break yarn and thread through the remaining 5 stitches, tighten to close. Weave in ends and attach pompom as demonstrated in the video, if desired.

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
